

10.1 Cllr. Leonard Kelly,

"I am calling on Wexford County Council, working with each municipal district to carry out a complete road safety audit on all estates that are taken in charge by Wexford County Council, with particular emphasis on the condition of existing speed ramps (and assessment of need for new ramp) and the erection of signage (Slow Down, Children at Play, etc.) as appropriate.

I have received many representations relating to reckless behaviour of some drivers within residential areas. The safety of residents and their children should not be dependent on makeshift signage or on discretionary funds being spent by individual councillors for things like speed ramps. Any and all safety upgrades need to be costed, budgeted and planned to give clarity to local residents.

We should not be found wanting in this regard."

10.2 Cllr. Tom Forde

We ask for the Wexford County Council tenant handbook to be reviewed with a view to ensuring that the council is held to the same standards and responsibilities that are expected of private landlords regarding repairs and other essential maintenance works.

11. Notices of Motions

11.1 Cllr. J. Hegarty

"Wexford County Council commits to include all Council playgrounds, parks, beaches and areas designed for children and young people as part of the initial phase of the Healthy County Committee "Not around us" campaign. This will establish a series of places and spaces all over County Wexford where children and young people can enjoy themselves in a smoke and vape free environment."

11.2 Cllr. Tom Forde

"This council recognises that asking a homeless individual or family to take up emergency accommodation outside of their district and away from their place of work or school, can negatively impact their employment and the education of school children. In its efforts to support our homeless the council will endeavour, now and in the future, to secure or provide emergency accommodation within the district where an individual or family have become homeless.

11.3 Cllr. L Kelly

"In 2021, Ireland's National Mental Health Budget represents only 5.1% of the national Health Budget. The World Health Organization recommends 12% Sláintecare recommends 10% The UK spends nearly 13% of their health budget on mental health.

Mental Health Reform, together with their 77 member organisations last month called on the Irish Government to increase Mental Health Budget spending to 10% of the total health budget by 2024. I ask the members of Wexford County Council to also support this call. "

11.4 Cllr. F. Ó Súilleabháin

"That Wexford County Council reviews what chemicals (and quantity of same) that we are adding to the county's water supply.

Working in cooperation with other bodies, we do an assessment of need and risk benefit analysis"

11.5 Cllr. Tom Forde

"This council calls on the government to recognise and vindicate the right of all persons to adequate housing by way of a referendum and asks that a date for a referendum on the right to housing is set for 2022."
