The following public art commissions, funded through the Per Cent for Art Scheme were completed during 2010:

 Cluain Charman Housing Scheme, Enniscorthy / Martin Lyttle
Wexford County Council is pleased to announce that a new sculpture
'Cherries' by Carlow stone sculptor
Martin Lyttle has been sited in Cluain
Charman Estate, Enniscorthy Town.
The work, as the name suggests,



comprises of three large black cherries, carved in Kilkenny limestone. This commission was funded by Per Cent for Art monies generated from the Cherryorchard Phase II Housing Scheme.

M11 Gorey to Arklow Link / Alex Pentek
 Wexford County Council is pleased to announce that a
 new landmark sculpture has been installed on the
 M11, Gorey to Arklow Link. The work, by artist Alex
 Pentek, depicts an 8 metre long, 4.5 metre tall origami
 inspired design, representing a hedgehog. This
 commission is being funded by Per Cent for Art monies
 generated from the construction of the M11 Gorey
 to Arklow Link.



Bunclody Main Drainage Scheme / Declan Breen.
A new sculpture 'Harmony of Leaves' by Declan Breen has been sicted on the Mall in Bunclody Town. The work comprisees of two bronze lime tree leaves and three large spheres on a granite base. This commission is being funded by Per Cent for Art monies generated from the Bunclody Sewerage Scheme.



 The Ros Tapestries, exhibited in the Ros Tapestry Exhibition Centre, New Ross, depict events around the Anglo-Norman arrival to the South East of Ireland. Fifteen striking embroidered panels, six by four foot in scale depict a dramatic presentation of the Norman Experience in Ireland.

Wexford County Council has commissioned one Ros Tapestry panel from the Per Cent for Art Allocation arising from the New Ross Main Drainage Scheme: 'Exchange: the Irish and



Normans mingle at the Fair'. This is the concluding panel in the collection and represents the Normans' modernising influence on Ireland by the introduction of European commerce and International trade.
