Minutes of Meeting of Wexford County Council held on Monday 12th November, 2018 – 1.30 p.m. in the Council Chamber, County Hall, Wexford.

1. Matt Shanahan, PRO, HEFSE:

Matt Shanahan, PRO, HEFSE, introduced his team of Dr. Aidan Buckley and Dr. Ray Griffin, Lecturer in Strategy, WIT. The attached presentation which is a review by Dr. Ray Griffin, of "the independent clinical review of the needs of the region" was shown to the Members of the Council.

All three speakers highlighted the defects/inequality in the south east region with regard to the timely treatment of cardiac patients. Furthermore, they highlighted the lack of a second cath lab to deal with cardiac patients at University Hospital Waterford.

The speakers outlined the background to this issue and set out the problems which are present in the south east region including County Wexford. The strategic under investment in the south east was also set out in the presentation.

The speakers referred to the Herity Report which recommended that all cardiac patients from the south east be transferred to Cork.

The Herity Report is flawed in so far as it was based on a UK standard with regard to the time taken to bring cardiac patients from the South-East to hospital. The time taken to get to a hospital to deal with cardiac care is critical –the speakers noted that the longer it takes to get to hospital the worse the outcome for the patient.

The Herity Report states that the critical time is the first 90 minutes following cardiac incidents - of the 196 patients transferred out of the region between 2015 and 2018 only 3 got to Cork in 90 minutes. The standard time for dealing with cardiac issues is 60 minutes and not 90 minutes as set out in the Herity Report.

Matt Shanahan pointed out that what the region needs now is a budget to provide a second cath lab in Waterford and a budget for staff to be recruited to facilitate the extension of the lab hours.

Following a wide-ranging discussion involving many of the Members of the Council, it was agreed that the Council would write to the Minister to seek a cross party meeting with him with regard to the issues raised.

2. Glenn Carr and Barry Kenny, Rail Freight & Rosslare Europort:

Glenn Carr, General Manager of Rosslare Port presented the Strategic Plan for Rosslare Port, as circulated, advising the Council of an investment of €15m to transform Rosslare Europort. The Plan set out an overview of Rosslare Europort business, its market and a layout of the port.

Following consideration of an environmental and SWOT analysis, a Recommended Strategy has been arrived at, as follows:

- To build up the port's capacity
- To progress 12 recommendations to achieve growth, improved efficiencies, mitigate market risks and position for future growth
- To prioritise the exploration of medium term intentions of key customers, the progression of efficiency discussions and the validation of capital investment requirements
- Brexit related engagements and preparations to continue in parallel.

Mr. Carr emphasised the need for an upgrade of the road into Rosslare Harbour, a new entrance into the port and a new customs building. He also highlighted a plan to extend the existing berths.

The Chief Executive T. Enright welcomed both Glenn Carr and Barry Kenny to the meeting to brief the Council. He paid tribute to Glenn Carr and with regard to investment proposals and profits being ploughed back into Rosslare Europort. He noted that he had met with the Chairman of the Irish Rail recently to discuss Rosslare Europort and the rail service to Dublin.

The Chief Executive noted that Glenn Carr dispelled a number of myths with regard to Rosslare Port in his presentation. He also noted that he was looking forward to the Ernst & Young Report being published.

Barry Kenny, Irish Rail, updated the meeting on Irish Rail's position with regard to the Rosslare Europort to Dublin railway line. He advised that there are no plans for any major changes to the line. However, there are plans to introduce extra intermediate rail cars.

He also highlighted a 9% increase of rail passengers in 2018, primarily due to a substantial reduction in fares over the summer period. Mr. Kenny also expressed concerns about the potential effects of coastal erosion on the rail line, calling for a medium to long term strategy to deal with the matter. He also confirmed that there is no plan to close the Gorey to Rosslare line.

The Chief Executive responded to Mr. Kenny stating that the Council had made a submission to Irish Rail last year with recommendations to improve the rail service to Dublin, including passengers disembarking to the Dart service at Bray, bypassing smaller stations to improve journey times, having more frequent train services, including an express service, and the upgrading of rail cars. He also referred to the potential risk to the rail line from coastal erosion

Members then raised a number of issues referring to both presentations including the following:

- Expansion of berths
- The Indecon Report
- The operation of the rail network
- The inclusion of the port's development in the National Development Plan 2040.
- The impediments to usage of the Port
- The opportunities arising from Brexit.
- Future Investment in the Port
- Draft restraint issues in the Port
- British Government view of making improvements to port at Fishquard
- Rebranding needs to be done
- Not too late to get haulers' back on the Rosslare/Fishguard route
- Cruise ships need input from the tourism board
- Rail freight and the need for change of government policy
- Price focused marketing to increase the travel between Rosslare Harbour and Dublin.
- Privatising berths

The Cathaoirleach then thanked Glenn Carr and Barry Kenny for their presentation and Glenn Carr advised that he would be happy to come back to the Members and update them on any further future progress in Rosslare Europort.

5. Part XI of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 (as amended) and Part 8, of the Planning and Development Regulations, 2001 (as amended):

5.1 LAC1805 - Creagh, Creagh Demesne, Gorey Rural

Proposed development of existing site to provide 12 no. social housing units to include 2 no. 3 bed semi-detached two storey units, 2 no. 2 bed semi-detached single storey units & 8 no. 2 bed apartments in 2 no. two storey block, and all auxillary and associated site works.

5.2 LAC 1806 - Crescent Quay, Wexford

Public Realm Improvements to Crescent Quay and along the waterfront promenade between Anne Street and Oyster Lane, and to Henrietta Street from Crescent Quay to Main Street, including: provision of bus stop, disabled parking space and access for delivery vehicles. New and enhanced pedestrian crossing points. New seating, planting, street furniture and street lighting. Undergrounding of existing overhead services and removal of existing poles. Reducing the existing road carriageway width to increase pedestrian space on both sides of the road. Raising of flood wall to enhance flood protection. High quality surface materials. Other miscellaneous works.

On the proposal of Cllr. R. Ireton seconded by Cllr. J. O'Rourke, the proposed developments, as submitted to the meeting, were approved and agreed by all.

6. Borrowing

Bank Overdraft Accommodation 2019

Ms. A. O'Neill, Head of Finance had circulated a report with regard to the Council's overdraft requirements for 2019 and advised that approval was being sought for borrowing by way of temporary overdraft accommodation of €13m for the period 1st January, 2019 to 31st December, 2019.

On the proposal of Cllr. R. Ireton, seconded by Cllr. A. Donohoe, the Members approved borrowing by way of temporary overdraft of €13m to 31st December 2019 in accordance with the provisions of Section 106 of the Local Government Act 2001.

Increased Borrowing Requirement for Publicly Funded Housing Mortgages

Ms. A. O'Neill, Head of Finance had circulated a report with regard to increased borrowing requirement to facilitate the completion of the Housing Mortgage Programme.

On the proposal of Cllr. M. Sheehan, seconded by Cllr. A. Donohoe, the Members approved additional borrowing of €1.5m for the 2018 Housing Mortgage Programme, in accordance with Section 106 of the Local Government Act 2001.

7. Audited Account and Statutory Audit Report for year ended 31st December 2017

The Audited Account and Statutory Audit Report for year ended 31st December was proposed by Cllr. M. Sheehan seconded by Cllr. A. Donohoe and agreed by all.

8. Naming of N25 By-Pass Bridge

Proposed by Cllr. J. Fleming seconded by Cllr. L. O'Brien it was agreed that the new bridge in New Ross would be called the Rose Fitzgerald Kennedy Bridge as had been proposed by the New Ross Municipal District.

9. 2017 Draft Annual Report (text version)

Proposed by Cllr. M. Sheehan seconded by Cllr. J. O'Rourke and agreed by all.

It was proposed by Cllr. M. Sheehan seconded by Cllr. M. Farrell to suspend Standing Orders to allow the meeting to continue to 6 p.m.

10. Report on Implementation of the Litter Acts in County Wexford

Mr. J. Carley, Director of Services, advised the Members that they had asked for a report on the implementation of the Litter Acts in County Wexford. The Members noted the report. Mr. G. Forde, Senior Engineer, and Hugh Maguire, Administrative Officer, advised the Members that they were going to visit each of the Municipal Districts to discuss the report in detail.

11. Proposed Draft Wexford County Council (Segregation, Storage and Presentation of Household and Commercial Waste) Bye-Laws 2018

Mr. J. Carley, Director of Services, advised that the Council had received two submissions arising from the public consultation which had been dealt with in the draft bye-laws.

The Bye-Laws were proposed by Cllr. O. Walsh seconded by Cllr. J. Fleming and agreed by all with the exception of Cllr. O. O'Connell.

12. Report on the Expansion of Environmental Clean-Up Crews (Rapid Response Crews) and Charges at Civic Amenity Sites in County Wexford.

The contents of this report were noted and it was agreed that the matters contained in the report would be discussed further at the Municipal Districts.

13. Wexford Great War Dead - Library Service Public History Research Project

Mr. J. Carley, Director of Services, advised that this website is now live and this was noted by the Members. The Members congratulated and thanked the Library Service for the work done in putting this website together.

Cllr. P. Kavanagh asked if work could be done on identifying soldiers who came back from the Great War and that information put into the archives as well.

The Director agreed to look at that proposal.

Cllr. M. Sheehan thanked Eileen Morrissey, County Librarian, and the Municipal District for the Remembrance Concert which took place in New Ross yesterday.

Cllr. W. Fitzharris thanked Nolan Transport for transporting a sculpture of the "Haunting Soldier" to St. Stephen's Green, Dublin.

Cllr. W. Kavanagh said that a very moving ceremony had taken place in Enniscorthy and thanked Nicola Halford and Liz Hore for organising the event and also thanked Cllr. Codd Nolan's sister for the amount of information she had passed on with regard to the Great War.

Cllr. T. Dempsey thanked Angie Laffan, Town Manager, Wexford, for the excellent ceremony that had taken place in Wexford.

14. WEXSCI Wexford Science Festival – 11th to 18th November 2018

Mr. J. Carley, Director of Services, advised that the Festival would be taking place in the next week and that it would be a showcase for science in County Wexford.

15. Call for submissions in relation to the Local Authority Elected Members Role and Remuneration Review

Mr. E. Taaffe, Director of Services, advised that the correspondence, as circulated, had been received from the Department seeking submissions from Members of the Council with regard to the role and remuneration review. It was also noted that the AILG and LAMA had made submissions to this review on behalf of their Members.

16. Report of Corporate Policy Group

On the proposal of Cllr. M. Sheehan seconded by Cllr. L. O'Brien the Report of Corporate Policy Group of 5th November, 2018 was approved by the meeting.

17. Chief Executive's Report

The Chief Executive's Report was considered by the Members. The Chief Executive and Members of the Management Team responded to Members queries arising from the report including the following:

"Following last month's decision by an Bord Pleanala to refuse planning permission for the proposed Greenway from Ferrybank to Curracloe, this Council absolutely reaffirms its commitment to developing a Greenway in this location. Furthermore we call on the Minister for Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht (who has responsibility for National Parks and Wildlife and Birdwatch Ireland) to meet with representatives from Wexford County Council to find an agreed solution that will protect the wildlife while allowing this flagship project for the county to go ahead".

23.4 Cllr. T. Dempsey

"That Wexford County Council would receive a deputation and presentation from HEFSE (Health Equality for the South East) to include Wexford Hospitals lead cardiologist Dr Aidan Buckley to inform the County Council members of the significant and negative service discrimination being suffered by Wexford Cardiac Patients in accessing regional acute and elective cardiac care".

23.5 Cllr. T. Dempsey

"That Wexford County Council would consider creating a cross party deputation and same to include local members of HEFSE to meet with Minister Simon Harris to both appraise him of the critical service issues on the ground and to request the immediate appointment of a full time Intervention al Cardiologist to begin intervention al duties in the Modular Catholic lab presently on site at UHW".

23.6 Cllr. O. O'Connell

"This Council, recognising:

- the historical impact of the Irish who like the Wild Geese have fought abroad throughout the centuries, out of necessity or commitment;
- the sacrifices and traumas of both fighters and survivors of those conflicts;
- the diversity of our diaspora and national experiences;
- our significant UN peacekeeping commitments;

Will commemorate all such broader "Wild Geese" simply, inclusively, and respectfully on November 11 ("Armistice Day"/US Veterans of Foreign Wars/Remembrance Day)"

Cllr. M. Sheehan asked if there had been any reply to a letter to the HSE regarding the number of GP's operating in County Wexford. It was also hoped that someone from the HSE would come to meet with the Council.
