ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Trinity Wharf

As part of the marketing strategy for Trinity Wharf, following on from development and roll out of 3D animation videos through social media and website, signage has been developed for Wexford GAA Park and Welcome Wall.

The Southeast Greenway

On March 27th, County Wexford Chamber hosted a public consultation meeting at the Brandon House Hotel in New Ross to discuss the potential economic impact of the Southeast Greenway. The event was well attended with over sixty participants. Ms. Jenny Beresford, CEO of Dungarvan & West Waterford Chamber gave a detailed presentation on the economic impact of the Waterford Greenway and lessons learned and highlighted examples of how new businesses developed and pivoted as a result of the Greenway. Ms. Jill Kelleher - WCC gave a presentation on the South East Greenway encouraging interested parties to engage directly with Wexford County Council, in particular LEO Wexford to explore new business opportunities for development and growth.

Town and Villages Renewal Scheme 2022

Wexford County Council received the official funding Agreement from the Department of Rural and Community Development (DRDC) for the Town and Villages Renewal Scheme 2022 confirming funding of €1,134,000. This is the highest investment in the South East and the 5th highest allocation of funding nationally for the Town and Villages Renewal scheme 2022. The following funding was allocated;

Duncannon; Development of the historic Duncannon Fort (€500,000).

Enniscorthy; Enniscorthy Wellbeing and Activity Garden, a place making development of an outdoor activity public green space. (€234,000)

Rosslare; Delivery of a Community and Enterprise Resource Centre/Hub in the strategic village of Rosslare Harbour (€250,000).

Enniscorthy; Funding under the Streetscape Enhancement Measure in Enniscorthy (€100,000).

Taghmon; Engagement of an archaeologist, conservation engineer, conservation architect, and QS to fully review site of Castle, prepare designs, construction method plans and costings to the bring castle into use as a heritage tourism asset. (€50,000).

The completion date for the above projects is 31 August 2024. Overall, these projects will help to boost tourism, create job opportunities, support local communities, and improve the quality of life for residents in these areas.

Savannah 2023

The Wexford delegation welcomed the Consul General Caoimhe Ni Chonchuir and Minister for Housing, Local Government & Heritage, Darragh O'Brien TD on their visit to Savannah to build on the Sister City Agreement signed last year with thew Mayor of Savannah to promote economic, social, education and cultural opportunities across both regions. The delegation's itinerary commenced with a meeting with family entrepreneurs, the Strickland's who run a successful number of tourism related businesses in 18 locations employing 450 staff. As an indication of the momentum that the Wexford brand is making in Savannah they have plans to renovate a large building located in the historic area of Savannah as a restaurant and hostelry to celebrate the historical linkages of Savannah and Ireland which will be named Wexford. The business partners will visit later in July to ensure to create an authentic Wexford experience. The historic district attracts 14 million visitors a year.

From an economic infrastructure perspective meeting with the Savanah Port Authority was extremely interesting and the Port has agreed to provide advice to Rosslare Europort and Wexford County Council in developing the logistics and maximising the strategic asset of the port. John Petrino, Director of Business Development & International Marketing at the headquarters of the Georgia Port Authority, gave an insight into the incredible growth of the port and in particular the use of rail as part of their almost exclusively Lo Lo (load on - load off) facilities.

The opportunity to meet business representatives and provide a presentation on Wexford County Council's economic investment programme was held at the offices of Savannah World Trade Centre and Savannah Economic Development Authority (SEDA. WCC were joined on the delegation by their Tradebridge partners Wexford Enterprise Chair Eleanor Modler. Further discussions took place with groups on areas of mutual interest such as , Visit Savannah, Film Savannah, and The Centre for Irish Research & Teaching (CIRT) which is based at Georgia Southern University.

Mayor Van Johnson hosted the delegation a year on from the inaugural signing of the sister city agreement with Wexford County Council. Mayor Johnson will be part of a large delegation of senior decision makers from Savannah in May this year.

St. Patrick's Day is the biggest event of the year in the City of Savannah and the second largest parade in America where the delegation represented Wexford with 750,000 visitors on the day. An Cathaoirleach, Cllr. George Lawlor was interviewed for TV station WTOC by Tim Guidere which was seen by an audience of approximately 300,000 viewers.

The trade ships which left the quays of Wexford town and New Ross in the mid 1800's is where the Savannah Wexford story begins. Following in our ancestors footsteps the delegation visited the Catholic cemetery in Savannah which is the final resting place of many Wexford people who made their home in South East Georgia. A remarkable 56% of all those of Irish ancestry in Savannah who travelled at this time, came from County Wexford and this

is borne out by the number of Wexford graves with names such as Kehoe, Rossiter, Whelan, Browne, Sinnott and Stafford.

A visit to the Savannah Coastal Heritage Society to see two of the last remaining houses that emigrants from Wexford would have lived in in great numbers as they began their new lives in Savannah. There is potential to explore coastal and maritime initiatives with the Savannah organisations.

The final highlight of the trip was the visit to Georgia Southern University where the delegation was hosted by the President Dr. Kyle Marrero and his team to discuss plans for the 150 students and academic team who are arriving for their international student experience in Wexford this summer at their Wexford campus. In addition the focus of the trip was to approve the design stage by the college to progress the student accommodation centre at the adoration convent. Further details are in the Savannah report by Cllr. George Lawlor Cathaoirleach and the Chairs of the Municipal Districts.



LECP

The Economic department is working in collaboration with the Community department to develop the new Local Economic Community Plan. March saw a number of consultations with key stakeholders such as economic and enterprise agencies and Municipal District area community meetings. KPMG are currently correlating the views of the consultation process to produce a draft report.

Tourism



On March 23rd Brittany Ferries in conjunction with Tourism Ireland held an event in the port of Bilbao on board the ship Salamanca to celebrate its 50th anniversary. The Brittany Ferries event was attended by 120 guests of which 30 were from the travel trade and tour operators.

Paula Fermandez Porta, Hotel Manager with the "Press Up Hospitality Group" presented on the new Ladyville House offering and exceptional tourism offering in County Wexford. The event also showcased Wexford food. Eoghan Corry and Isabel Conway Nagel, were part of the Irish travel media group on the crossing from Rosslare to Bilbao and it is hoped that they will give good press coverage, particularly with a focus on sustainable holiday growth from Spain to Ireland.

Tourism Ireland in co-operation with Brittany Ferries have created a new marketing campaign commencing in early April and running until May "Ireland reaches your heart" targeting increasing the number of Spanish visitors to Ireland.



Local Enterprise Office

The final event of Local Enterprise Week was held 24th March in the Council Chamber with 55 businesses in attendance. Mr. Blaise Brosnan of the Management Resource Institute addressed how small changes in a business can have maximum positive impact in an inflationary business environment. Enterprise Week was very successful with over 220 business engagements in various events from specialist social media training, business clinics, International Women's Day breakfast/LIFT training and lean business practices.

Spotlight Clients 2023

As part of our marketing strategy, LEO Wexford developed 5 video case studies from client companies. An Cathaoirleach, Cllr. George Lawlor formally launched these case studies at the breakfast event on the 24th March. Video case studies included Bodibro, Tasty Parlour, MachineLab, Feri and Coatek. These clients represent the cross-section and variety of business types and showcase the business supports that LEO Wexford can offer.



LIFT Ireland and Local Enterprise Office Wexford

LIFT Ireland is a social enterprise initiative aimed at increasing the level of positive leadership in Ireland that can impact across all aspects of business, culture and society. The Local Enterprise Office, in association with LIFT Ireland, as part of its International Women's Day activities offered a LIFT Round-Table Leadership Building Activity to event participants. Taking an innovative approach, the round-table activity was facilitated by Ramsgrange Community School Transition Year students, who are trained LIFT Facilitators



as part of their TY programme. The programme was offered to the Women in Business Network and to date thrty-one female entrepreneurs have signed up to be trained as LIFT facilitators which LEO Wexford/LIFT Ireland will delivery in early May. Once the training is complete the participants will be enabled to deliver LIFT activities to their own businesses, peer groups and the wider community.





Export Readiness Programme 2023

LEO Wexford, to accelerate the growth of its clients, particularly to expand beyond the domestic market, has successfully delivered a half day Introduction to Export Programme. Ten businesses will be selected to participate in a follow on 6-month intensive export programme which will include training, market study visit and client meetings in targeted export markets. The tender for delivery of the programme has been awarded to Full Circle.

Student Enterprise Awards

LEO Wexford continues to promote an enterprise culture through the delivery of the Student Enterprise Programme and the County Final took place on Wednesday 9th March in County Hall.



The overall winner of the senior category was Organis3D from the CBS Enniscorthy. The senior category winner together with the intermediate winner, Positive Pots, Ramsgrange Community School and the junior winner, Wasteknot, CBS Wexford will go on to represent Wexford at the national finals of the Student Enterprise Awards May.

Forward Planning

Wexford Town Local Area Plan

A series of information meetings has commenced with the Members of the Borough District of Wexford to discuss the preparation of the new Local Area Plan for Wexford Town. These sessions will focus on the process for preparing the plan and the role, function and required content of the plan. They will enable the Members early input into both the strategic planning issues and critical parts of the process such as the Consultation Strategy for the plan.

Significant desktop research and field survey work has been carried out to inform the plan. Consultants have been appointed to carry out the Strategic Environmental Assessment, Appropriate Assessment and Strategic Flood Risk Assessment. Consultants have been appointed to prepare the Local Transport Plan and initiation meetings have been held with the consultants and the National Transport Authority.

The next stages will be the development of a Consultation Strategy, Issues Papers and Baseline Reports and the Strategic Environmental Assessment Scoping Report (SEA Directive), Social and Community Audit and an Infrastructure Assessment Report requested by the Members.

The Draft Planning and Development Bill 2022 has been published and this will change the format of the plan. The planning section are reviewing the revised requirements of the Draft Bill and will advise further as soon as possible.

Enniscorthy Town Local Area Plan

Background work has commenced for Enniscorthy Town Local Area Plan. Quotations were sought for the Appropriate Assessment and Strategic Environmental Assessment, but no submissions were received. The Draft Planning Bill 2022 has been published and this will change the format of the plan.

The Planning Section are reviewing the revised requirements of the Bill and will advise further as soon as possible.

Built, Cultural & Natural Heritage

County Heritage Forum

The first meeting of the County Heritage Forum took place on the 28.03.2023, with a variety of stakeholders in attendance at County Hall. The County Heritage Forum is a non-statutory advisory group established by the council to assist in the formulation and implementation of the County Heritage Plan. The Forum includes elected representatives, representatives from the community sector and a range of organisations and state agencies with an interest in or responsibility for, the heritage of Co. Wexford.



County Heritage Plan Scheme funding

Wexford County Council has received funding from the Heritage Council for the following projects under the County Heritage Plan scheme: A phase 1 audit of the historic church and graveyard sites of Co. Wexford, a conservation management plan for St. Nicholas' of Clonmines, and facilitation for public consultation of the County Heritage Plan.

Historic Towns Initiative funding

Wexford County Council has received funding from the Heritage Council and the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage for the undertaking of a heritage-led regeneration plan for Enniscorthy.

Built Heritage Investment Scheme funding.

Building owners in Co. Wexford have been awarded grant support from the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage to undertake repairs to Protected Structures and vernacular buildings. The Built Heritage Investment Scheme is administered through Local Authorities. Projects such as thatch renewal, timber sash window repair and lime render replacement will be undertaken.

National Meeting of Heritage Officers

A national meeting of Local Authority Heritage Officers and the Heritage Council took place in Wexford on the 22nd and 23rd March. Over the two days Heritage Officers attended a variety of presentations and field trips and discussed diverse topics such as the threats presented by coastal erosion, climate and biodiversity loss, and the potential of urban regeneration, vernacular heritage and archaeological monuments to raise heritage awareness.

MAJOR NATIONAL ROADS PROJECTS

N11/N25 Oilgate to Rosslare Harbour

- Ground Investigation on-site works have started and will be ongoing for further 14 weeks.
- Environmental surveys, traffic studies and traffic modelling are ongoing.
- Archaeological Geophysical Survey Tender was published on 27th March 2023. Return date for Tenders is 28th April 2023
- Additional Topographical Survey Tender is expected to be published in April 2023.
- Development of the bridge options is ongoing.
- Engagement with the ESB/EirGrid is ongoing. Project Team was notified by the ESB that a
 viable solution to all conflict points identified between proposed alignment and ESB/EirGrid
 high/medium voltage lines has been achieved. Drawings from ESB/EirGrid are expected to
 come through in early April 2023.
- Engagement with the landowners is ongoing. One-on-one meetings with all directly affected landowners are taking place on 3rd and 4th of April 2023 in Ferrycarrig Hotel. Valuable information is expected to be collected at the meetings in order to finalise the design, which is required to determine the Compulsory Purchase Order (CPO).

N25 Rosslare Europort Access Road

An Bord Pleanála informed Project Team in late February 2023 that Oral Hearing in relation to the proposed road development and CPO is scheduled for 5th April 2023 due to two unresolved objections to the CPO received by the Bord, that Project Team was not made aware of.

The Project Team managed to resolve two outstanding objections in early March 2023, resulting in cancellation of Oral Hearing by An Bord Planeála. Notification of cancellation was received on 14th March 2023.

Therefore, the position on this project remains unchanged and we are still awaiting a decision from the Bord. Revised anticipated decision date is 26th May 2023.

NATIONAL ROAD PAVEMENT SCHEMES

2022 Pavement Schemes

N25 Ballykilliane to Orristown Pavement Scheme

(Estimated Total Scheme Cost €2,000,000)

This scheme is 2 km in length and runs between the R739 Kilmore junction to the L7050 Orristown junction on the N25.

The contract was awarded on 24th October.

Drainage works were completed in March. This scheme is due to be completed by the end of April.

N80 Tomacurry to Ballycarney Phase 1

(Estimated Total Scheme Cost €2,000,000)

The total scheme length is 3.7km. The allocation from TII for 2022 allows for the first 2 km at the southern end to be completed in 2022.

The contract was awarded on 22nd November.

Pavement works commenced on 6th. February. The pavement works are substantially completed by the end of March.

2022 Safety Schemes

N25 Ballygillane Roundabout

(Estimated Total Scheme Cost €2,590,000)

This scheme was tendered in November 2021.

Works commenced on 23rd May 2022 and should be substantially completed by Mid April

2023 Pavement Schemes

N80 Tomacurry to Ballycarney Phase 2

(Estimated Total Scheme Cost €1,600,000)

This scheme is being designed at present. It is hoped to tender this scheme in April and construct the scheme in July and August.

N25 Orristown to Ashfield Cross Pavement Scheme

(Estimated Total Scheme Cost €1,600,000)

This scheme is being designed at present. It is hoped to tender this scheme in May/June and construct the scheme in September and October.

2023 Additional Maintenance Allocations

Wexford County Council will be applying for additional maintenance funding from TII in January 2023. This will relate to pavement repairs on sections of the N80 north of Ballycarney and sections of the N30.

Wexford County Council will continue to apply for additional maintenance funding for drainage and verge maintenance works on the N11, N25, N30 and N80.

A consultant has been appointed to carry out a drainage design for a section of the N25 between Barntown and Larkins cross that flooded twice since 25th December 2021. A preliminary meeting was held with the consultant on site in January. It is hoped to have a designed solution in place by the end of the first quarter of the year.

Former National Roads Grant 2023

2 applications were made under this scheme for 2023.

- R772 Tinnock to Gorey (1.4km)
- R723 Rosbercon (0.8km).

Funding of €500,000 was received for the R772 Tinnock scheme. This amounts to 50% of the scheme.

It is hoped to tender this work in the second quarter of 2023.

REGIONAL AND LOCAL ROADS

The Regional and Local Road Grant Allocations were announced on 14 February 2023. Wexford's allocation was €22,811,650. This allocation includes €1,000,000 for Christmas day 2021 flood damage and €1,500,000 for the Deeps Bridge remediation works.

Resurfacing/Strengthening

The 2023 strengthening programme (Machinery Yard) commenced in the Enniscorthy District on 25 January 2023 at Bucks Bridge, Ballindaggan.

Roads resurfaced in macadam in the last month were:

Ballindaggin Village; Ballyhamilton; (Both in Enniscorthy District); Yoletown to Boley Junction; Fardy's Cross to Knockanduff Junction; Rosbercon; Garrycullen Cross to Saintkierans; (All in New Ross District); Scurloguebush; Richfield; Cleristown; Coramacorra; Twelve Acre to Trimmer; (All in Rosslare District).

Surface Dressing Works

The surface dressing programme is expected to commence in June.

Community Involvement Schemes

€502,650 was allocated in 2023. The Municipal Districts are finalising their programmes.

Local Improvement Schemes

€411,705 was allocated to County Wexford in Round 1, 2023. The Round 1 list has been approved by the Department.

Bridge Rehabilitation Grant

Wexford County Council was allocated €610,000 to repair 17 bridges in 2023. Work is scheduled to commence in the next month.

Christmas Day 2021 - Flood Damaged Bridges

Temporary Bailey Bridges are in place at Chapel and Cullenstown Little. Section 50 consents have been received from the OPW for the 3 bridges (Chapel, Cullenstown and Wilton). Detailed designs are in progress for all 3 bridges. Chapel and Cullenstown require Part 8 planning and will likely be concrete bridge beam construction. Wilton Bridge will be repaired as was (masonry arch) commencing in July. All 3 re-constructions will commence in 2023.

Specific Improvement Works - The Deeps Bridge

The Deeps Bridge Remediation Project – RPS Consulting Engineers Ltd was appointed as Project Supervisor for the Design Process in March 2021.

Glas Civil Engineering commenced work 9 January 2023. The project is progressing well. The bridge surface has been stripped down to the bridge deck. A retaining wall on the east side of the bridge has been constructed. Concrete repairs are in progress bridge with over 100 complete out of a total of 250. Encapsulation of the bridge is in progress. It is anticipated the works will be complete by the end of August 2023.

Winter Maintenance

The Winter Maintenance started 17 October 2022 and finishes 30 April 2023. There have been 54 treatments to Thursday 30 March 2023.

General Maintenance

Drainage, patching and road surface repair works are ongoing in all Districts.

ACTIVE TRAVEL

The Active Travel Team are currently in negotiations with the NTA regarding additional funding on top of the allocation announced on Feb 3rd, 2023.

The Section 38 process for Newtown Rd from the Hospital junction in towards Wygram Junction has commenced with a closing date for submissions to **24th April 2023**.

We had a productive quarterly meeting with the NTA on Wednesday 8th March to discuss and visit schemes under design and requested additional funding (€1m) where necessary.

We are progressing 3 no. Safe Routes to School (SRTS) from round 1, designed in house and consultation ongoing, Adamstown Scoil Naomh Abbann, Scoil Mhuire Rosslare, Saint Aidan's Enniscorthy. Section 38's are being prepared with a view to construction in 2023.

Round 2 Safe Routes To School to be progressed through An Taisce initially who carry out Parent Surveys and the first steps of consultation with schools. This results in an Outline Delivery Plan (ODP) which is the supporting documentation from the survey and audits carried out for the school. Active Travel then take this plan to develop it into a detailed design for the school.

- R723 Oaklands to Kents Cross, New Ross which is for a Segregated Cycle Scheme, and which is at Preliminary Design Stage. The plan is to find the additional funds in order to take this scheme through the Part 8 planning process in 2023.
- Plans are being put in place for Bike Week 2023 which takes place next year between the 13th and 21st of May. Applications for funding for running events were submitted in early January 2023 and funding of €7,800 was awarded. A variety of events will be held around the County to promote cycling to all age groups and abilities.
- Introduction of Public E Bike Sharing Scheme Wexford Town in April/May identification of parking places is now near completion and line marking and erection of signage will commence shortly. We require 45 parking locations spread across the town in residential areas and near shopping/university/bus and train station/ town centre locations to ensure the scheme is as user friendly as possible.

Presentation to Wexbug & Councillors

Members of WexBUG (Wexford Bicycle Users Group) attended a training day which took place on Friday 10th Feb. The aim of this presentation was to gather what matters to the cyclist when using these routes. We invited feedback and explained the design philosophies we follow when designing these pathfinder schemes.

The Active Travel team presented to Wexford District Elected Members on Mon 6th March at 3:30 p.m. on plans and design philosophies followed by Active Travel.

PUBLIC LIGHTING

LED Upgrade (Non-National Roads)

Over 12,000 lanterns have been upgraded to LED since the beginning of 2016.

Design works are completed.

Works are almost complete bar installing Led trays in the Heritage decorative lanterns across the county. It is hoped to complete the upgrade of these remaining lanterns on non-National roads and housing estates in the first half of the year.

A plan will be put in place to upgrade the remaining lanterns in housing estates that were taken in charge over the last 4 to 5 years.

Public Lighting Development Fund

Additional public lighting will be installed at the following locations under the Public Lighting Development Fund in 2023.

- Ramsfort Avenue Gorey infill along by GAA pitch. Lighting design being carried out and quotations due in March.
- The Ballagh Church to the school Lighting design being carried out and quotations due in March.
- The Ballagh Ballagh Cove to regional road. Lighting design being carried out and quotations due
 in February/March
- Wexford Town Seamus Kelly roundabout to Spawell Road. 1 quotation received and further quotation due within the week. It is hoped to get this scheme awarded in early March. due in January.

Other locations will follow further to consultations with Municipal District Engineers.


It should be noted that quotations are sought from the four recognised public lighting contractors in the country for these public lighting schemes. All four contractors are now working on the 3 National Public Lighting Energy Efficiency Programme (PLEEP) contracts across the country. This is leading to a delay in getting our Development Fund lighting contracts designed, tendered and completed.

Ukrainian Community Response Forum

The next meeting of the Ukrainian Community Response Forum will be held on the 24th April 2023. It was agreed at the last meeting that the meetings will be held every quarter. The Community Response Forums are providing essential local engagement spaces for all of the public, non-profit and private bodies who are involved in the provision of services and supports locally. This forum ensures that all of these groups operating locally are working together for the best outcome for those in need of support.

Offer a Home

There was a small increase in offers due to our media campaign in March. The team continue to place displaced Ukrainian families in properties across Wexford, in both rural and urban areas, to date some 75 properties have been allocated.

Refurbishment Projects

Several pilot refurbishment projects are being investigated. They will either be owner led or developed by Wexford County Coucil subject to approval by the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage.

Other Initiatives

Community Recognition Fund

County Wexford has been allocated €1,509,870 under The Community Recognition Fund. Details of the fund were circulated to the elected members, Municipal District Administrators, members of the Local Economic and Community SPC, the Ukraine Community Response Forum, the LCDC and PPN (Peoples Participation Network). The fund was advertised through local media, social media and on www.wexfordcoco.ie and expressions of interest invited. The closing date for expressions of interest was February 28th and the final date for receipt of applications by the Department is March 15th.

Over 40 expressions of interest were received and whilst not all met the criteria it has been possible to allocate funding to most of the eligible projects using the criteria of the scheme with an equitable allocation per district based on the latest CSO data. The final list of projects was submitted to the Department on March 15th and the announcement of approved projects is imminent.



SPECIAL PROJECTS

1. Projects at Planning Stages

1.1 Enniscorthy Town Centre & Tourism Project:

The Planning Department in collaboration with Special Projects has developed a strategic plan for Enniscorthy town centre, which was adopted at the Enniscorthy MD meeting in December 2022.

The public realm aspects of the tourism projects will form part of the Call 4 URDF application expected in the Q3 2023.

Moloney O' Bernie has been appointed to prepare preliminary designs and Part VIII planning application for the Market Square and the Castle Quarter by July and September respectively to support the Call 4 application for Enniscorthy.

1.2 Forth Mountain Activity Park – Phase 2 - Activity Centre Building:

Phase 1 – Forth Mountain Activity Park, Trails and Carpark is complete.

The activity centre building was lodged for Part VIII planning in March 2022. In response to a request from An Bord Pleanála for further information relating to the project was completed and submitted to the Board. The Part VIII planning application was withdrawn in October 2022. A process to procure a consulting team to prepare an EIAR and prepare a planning submission to ABP is now required.

The part VIII for the proposed boathouse and external toilet facility on-site was approved by WCC in February 2023 and the detailed design is progressing. The tender for works will be advertised in March and it is expected that a contract award will be made by August with a commencement on site by Sept 2023.

1.3 Min Ryan Park

Sole Sports and Leisure was appointed to construct the skate park and MUGA on a design and build basis. The MUGA and skatepark are now both complete and open to the public. Killaree Lighting Services is appointed to install public lighting to both projects, which will be commence in early April 2023.

1.4 Gorey District Park

The park is substantially completed and is now fully open to the public.

The second invitation to tender for the Changing Places unit did not result in an award of contract. A third invitation to tender for the Changing Places unit has now been advertised on eTenders with tender submission due in April.

1.5 John Street Building Regeneration Project, New Ross

A portion of the grain store building has been purchased by agreement and the CPO for the remaining sections is now formally complete. ODKM Architects are appointed and undertook a preplanning meeting for the building in February. The Part VIII application for approval by WCC will be prepared and presented to the New Ross MDC at the May meeting with Part 8 to commence immediately thereafter.

1.6 Gorey Market House

As agreed at the December meeting of Gorey - Kilmuckridge MDC, WCC publicly invited Expressions of Interest in February 2023 for the re-development of the Market House. A Competitive Dialogue procurement process is being used to identify best options for a town centre development, including a performance space. Initial expressions of interest are due by 20th April. Stage 2 in this dialogue process will take up to 10 months to complete.

1.7 WEXFORDIA – Irish National Heritage Park (INHP), Hook Lighthouse and New Ross Tourism Projects

WCC secured RRDF Category 2 funding for the development of a cluster of tourism projects within the county.

Irish National Heritage Park: INHP

The tourism and environmental design teams for the INHP have commenced work on a preliminary design and the environmental assessments. It is planned to submit a planning application for the project to An Bord Pleanála in Q4 2023.

Hook Lighthouse

The tender competition for interpretative design services for the Hook Lighthouse was advertised in February with closing date for tenders on 30/03/23.

The Brief for the associated architectural and related design services was advertised in March. It is expected that the preliminary design and the planning applications will be completed in 2023 and submitted to ABP.

The environmental consultant has been appointed and is undertaking initial studies and investigative works.

New Ross Tourism Project

Tenders for the interpretive fitout on the Dunbrody Visitor Centre Experience has been received and a contract award is expected in April.

Tender documents for the development of the Norman Centre in the Old Bank/Murphy buildings for interpretive and architectural services will be advertised in March 2023 with appointments expected in May and July respectively.

1.8 Esmonde Street, Gorey

An on-site meeting took place with the Members in Gorey – Kilmuckridge MDC in February 2023 and proposals for the street were discussed. A presentation will be made to the Members in April. €2m of own funds is committed to the Esmonde Street project. It is then planned to proceed to detailed design, tender and contract award, with works to commence on site before end of 2023.

1.9 Rosslare Europort to Waterford City Greenway

The Economic SPC of Wexford County Council and the Transportation SPC of Waterford City & County Council have written to the Minister for Transport seeking inclusion of the out-of-service Rosslare to Waterford railway line in the impending national rail review.

The application for planning consent for the Rosslare to Waterford greenway project has been paused, pending the publication of the All-Ireland Rail Review, that will determine the future of the line.

The Rosslare Harbour to Rosslare Strand section is now being advanced as part of the Wexford Town to Rosslare greenway project.

1.10 Wexford Town to Rosslare Greenway

Fehily Timoney & Co has been appointed to provide consultancy services for a feasibility study, route selection, preliminary design and environmental assessments for the development of this project. Constraints have been identified and ecological surveys are on-going. The scoping and route options process is ongoing. Public consultation on the preferred route corridor options commenced on 11th May 2022 with submissions closing on June 10th 2022.

Fehily Timoney & Co has been appointed to review the route options for the proposed Rosslare Harbour to Rosslare Stand greenway in light of the significant coastal protection works which has been carried out over the past two years by Irish Rail. An ecological survey is on-going.

1.11 Old Dublin Road Business Park, Enniscorthy

In May 2021, outline proposals for the Old Dublin Road were presented to the Enniscorthy Municipal District. This was followed by a public consultation process in late June on the draft plan. The masterplan was presented to the Enniscorthy MDC's October meeting. The initial phase 1 works commenced in July/August 2022 and are now substantially completed.

An application for further funding has been prepared and submitted to the NTA, in conjunction with the Roads & Transportation Section, for the active travel elements of the masterplan.

1.12 Courtown Coastal Protection & Beach Nourishment Scheme

Following a competitive tender process, RPS Ltd was appointed to undertake the Preliminary Design and Statutory Consents Phase of the Courtown coastal protection and beach nourishment scheme.

Priority Geotechnical Ltd. is appointed to carry out the marine and land-based surveys and boreholes at Courtown. They commenced work on the May 2022 and the site investigation work is complete.

Marine profiling surveys will also be carried out in parallel at this time and this work is being carried out by Hydrographic Survey Limited. An application to the Marine Foreshore Dept., was submitted in December 2022, for permission to carry out benthic grab samples. This work will commence once approval is granted.

It is planned to submit an application to An Bord Pleanála for development consent in Autumn 2023.

1.13 Crescent Quay - Dredging

RPS Consulting Engineers have been appointed to provide design services for dredging works at Crescent Quay. The sampling and testing of the proposed dredge material, to inform the statutory consent process, is underway. It is planned to submit the statutory consent applications by Q4 2023.

1.14 Enniscorthy Sports Hub

O'Leary Sludds Architects were appointed in Feb 2021 for the detailed design, procurement of works contractor and construction management of the Sport Hub building. A competition to award a works contract for the sports hub building was advertised in May 2022. The lowest price tender opened for the project exceeded the available budget and no contract was awarded. A redesign process for the project is now underway, and the project will be retendered in Q2 2023.

1.15 Curracloe Water Sports Activity Facility

WCC received Stage 2 compliance approval from Fáilte Ireland for the development of facilities to support water sports activities at Whitegap, Curracloe. The project will include showers, toilets, changing facilities and lockers.

Following the tender process for design services in Jan 2022, Neville Conroy Architects is appointed. Surveying works and detailed design commenced in January 2023. It is planned to tender and commence works in 2023.

1.16 Ferndale Gymnasium, Wexford:

Sports Capital funding of €300,000 has been secured for this project, supporting a donation of €500,000 from William Neville and Sons for this project. Part VIII approved was received in 2022 and a design team is currently being appointed to prepare detailed designs and tender documents for the works. It is planned to tender for a works contractor by Q2 2023 and to commence works on site by Q4 2023.

1.17 Adoration Convent Wexford

Part VIII is in place for this project to convert the old convent into accommodation for students of Georgia Southern University Wexford campus. A design team appointment is approved by GSU. It is intended to tender in Q2 with works to commence before end of 2023.

2 Projects Under Construction

2.1 South East Greenway

Contracts for the works on Lots 1, 2 and 3 were awarded to Glás Civil Engineering and works are now substantially complete. Snagging works are currently ongoing.

The works have commenced on site, following a tender process, for fencing, public lights ducting and temporary car parks for the greenway section from New Ross to Glenmore.

The expected completion date is June 2023.

Contract for Lot 5a – Ferrybank to Curraghmore (5.5KM) was advertised in March with a works tender award is expected by July 2023.

Contract for Lot 4 – Mount Elliot will be advertised in October with works is expected to commence on site early in 2024.

Wexford County Council's Arts Office, in partnership with the Southeast Greenway Project Team, has commissioning designers 'Elements Of Action' with visual artist Aoife Banville, to develop a pilot creative public art project for the Raheen to Glenmore section of the greenway. This works is expected to complete prior to the opening of this section.

2.2 Trinity Wharf

The contract for the construction of the access road was awarded to Glás Civil Engineering Ltd, in January 2023 and works commenced on site in late February. The sod turning took place on site on 2nd March with Minister Darragh O'Brien and elected representatives.

Procurement of consultants for design services for the site development and public infrastructure works is underway. The preferred tenderer is identified, and the standstill period is in operation. The formal appointment of the design services consultant is expected in April 2023.

2.3 New Ross Emigrants' Park - Oil Tanks Site

This project consists of removal of the oil tank structures on the Quay and the development of public realm works on the site. The Advance Works Contract (Removal of Tanks) was complete in July 2021.

RRDF funding of €814,393 for the project was announced in November 2022. The main works contract has been awarded to MJS and works have commenced.

2.4 Mechanics Institute, Wexford

The works contract for essential maintenance works at the Mechanics Institute has been awarded to Roger Doyle Contractors and works commenced on site in January 2023. Works are expected to take 6 months complete.

2.5 Oyster Lane Site, Wexford

A Part VIII submission has been made for the demolition of existing unoccupied buildings on the old Tesco site, including the construction of a temporary surface level car park.

The Part VIII was confirmed at the March 2022 County Council meeting. O'Connor Sutton Cronin consulting engineers have been appointed to provide design and construction related consultancy services for the project.

The demolition contract has been awarded to John Tinnelly & Sons (Ireland) Ltd. Works have commenced on site.

4. Flood Defence Schemes

4.1 Enniscorthy Flood Defence Scheme

Statutory Process - The Minister for the Department of Public Expenditure & Reform (DPER) issued his decision to refuse the scheme on 4th March 2022. Details are available on www.gov.ie. Following the decision, the OPW confirmed their commitment to delivering an effective scheme for Enniscorthy.

The Minister for State, Mr Patrick O'Donovan and senior officials from the OPW & WCC attended a special meeting of Enniscorthy MDC on 4th May 2022 to update the members in relation to the Enniscorthy Flood Defence Scheme.

Flood Defence Scheme - The hydrology and ecology baseline data is currently being updated. The scheme alternatives are to be assessed, consulted on publicly and a preferred option identified. MMD has issued a programme of work – the preferred option report & environmental assessment reports are scheduled to be completed in Q3 2023. It will be necessary to review planning options and the preferred planning mechanism selected.

New River Slaney Bridge - The ecology baseline data is currently being updated and the traffic surveys are complete. ROD has issued a programme of work.

4.2 Wexford Flood Relief Scheme

The contract for engineering and environmental services for the for the Wexford Town & Environs contract was signed by WCC and Nicholas O'Dwyer Ltd on 23rd March. Officials from the OPW, the sponsoring agency for the scheme, including the Minister Mr Patrick O'Donovan, attended. A preliminary cost estimate of €9.52m has been approved by the OPW for scheme, which will fully funded.

The appointment will include flood risk modelling; assessment of options for flood prevention; preliminary design; the preparation of planning and other statutory consent applications; detailed design; tendering for works contractors and construction management services.

The application process was open until the 28th of February 2023 with applications limited in value to €5,000 per group. Over 226 applications were received, with the members of the LCDC approving funding of €340k across county Wexford.

WEXFORD LOCAL ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY PLAN (LECP)

A comprehensive series of public consultation events for the Wexford Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) took place throughout March across the County.

The aim of the engagement, to build up a detailed on the ground understanding of county Wexford – its existing strengths and constraints, as well as opportunities available to the county and to generate ideas in relation to objectives and specific actions as well as associated KPIs which will be included in the first 2-year implementation plan.



Consultants from KPMG Future Analytics and members of the Community and Economic Development departments visited all municipal districts to engage with all stakeholders with additional online events also taking place.

In addition to this, a series of structured interviews, workshops and focus groups were held with key stakeholders including council representatives, sector representatives, state and semi-state agencies and elected members, private sector bodies, and key business groups.

Work has been completed on the following Capital Enhacement Projects:



They had a very full and tight agenda visiting over 8 businesses and Partner areas over the three days. Feedback to date has been very encouraging. Irish Partner area businesses are visiting Wales from the 28th to the 30^{th of} March.



Dundalk Chamber held their first in person Cross Border Tourism Conference in the beautiful surroundings of the Four Seasons Carlingford on the 29th of March. With over 200 booked, in the event was a resounding success. The event brought experts together from various Tourism projects around Ireland and the UK, chaired by Kieran Swail of the Southern Regional College with Brendan McSherry Heritage Officer with Louth County Council chairing the question and answer session. Speakers were: Oonagh Messette – Celtic Routes Project Officer, Wayne Denner of 10th Step, John Fitzgerald Glass Box Events, Frazer Coupland of Lochaber Chamber of Commerce and Pól Ó Conghaile – Travel Editor with the Irish Independent.



A total of 4 Virtual Reality headsets will be purchased for each of the partners including the Wexford County Council partner, loaded with the Celtic Routes 360 degree drone footage of the Project area and hopefully made available to the Library Services at the beginning of September following the Project closure. There will be capacity on these headsets for a lot more content to be added.

Upcoming coverage includes – Press Trips for the Celtic Routes entirety from The Sun, Le Monde and Lonely Planet Germany; Social Influencers for the Celtic Collection specifically from Germany, France and the Netherlands and 4 UK and Irish influencers with an additional 3 press trips.

ENVIRONMENT

A. COASTAL MATTERS

Harbours -

In April 2022, Department of Ag, Food & Marine (DAFM) announced funding of 23 projects with a total construction cost of €1.4m in Co. Wexford under a new scheme to develop works on LA harbours, called the Brexit Adjustment Local Authority Marine Infrastructure (BALAMI) 2022 – 2023. The DAFM approved a second tranche of funding in December 2022, with a total between first and second tranches of 25 projects with total construction cost of €1.79m. The DAFM funding has increased from 85% to 95%, with Wexford County Council paying the 5% match funding on construction. Note that WCC must pay all non-construction costs including design, environmental reports etc.

Fethard Harbour – New Slipway and Beach Access. Consulting engineers are appointed to progress the detailed design. A planning application was lodged with An Bord Pleanála with a

notice published in the paper on 1st March 2023, observations and submissions can be submitted up to 21st April 2023. This development is part of the above BALAMI scheme.

Ports Past and Present: There is ongoing engagement with the Rosslare community, artists, and our project partners in University College Cork and two Welsh universities. The street in County Hall will host an exhibition of work created by Irish and Welsh artists for the Ports Past and Present. The artists turned their creative vision to the often-overlooked port communities around Rosslare Harbour, Fishguard, Pembroke Dock, Holyhead and Dublin.

The exhibition is open until 14th March 2023 and features sculpture, audio, photography, drawing, print, digital, film, poetry and storytelling.

ISPS requirements for Marshmeadows Jetty have been approved for dry cargo operations. The process to extend certification for liquid cargoes is ongoing.

The regularization of the public lighting system on the Barrow is ongoing, new lights have been fitted to Marshmeadows access road and Jetty.

Upgrade works to the Jetty in Marshmeadows including, fendering, public lighting, CCTV and security fencing are significantly completed. New business has been generated with the arrival of the barge "Pompei" on 12th March. This is the first new business for the port in over a decade.

Beaches -

Ballymoney Blue Flag Beach – Access for All and Age Friendly Improvement Works. Wexford CC confirmed funding of €160,000 towards accessibility and age friendly improvement works which include the beach access and accessible toilets.

Rosslare Strand – Bearlough: 2 new disabled car spaces at the entrance to Rosslare Burrow Holiday Park are completed. These spaces will provide access to the beach along the new macadam path that was constructed in 2021.

Coast -

The Environment Dept monitors the coastline regularly, focussing on erosion risk areas. In addition, there has been a drop in beach levels at many beaches as a result of winter storms. We will also continue to monitor this and expect the beaches to recover over the next number of months.

Rosslare Coastal Erosion and Flood Relief Scheme: Nicholas O'Dwyer Ltd Consulting Engineers is appointed to progress the scheme. Key design parameters for the scheme are being finalised. Flood and erosion options are being developed and it is expected that public consultation days will be held in the coming months.

The project website and project email are now live and can be accessed at https://www.floodinfo.ie/rosslarefrs/

There is provision on the website to email the project team with specific queries.

<u>Seaview, Kilmore:</u> emergency works to protect the access road were completed in Jan 2022. Ecological, bathymetric and seabed surveys on the overall coastal protection scheme are complete. University College Cork is undertaking coastal modelling. A planning application will be submitted to An Bord Pleanála which will include coastal protection works and a new beach

access, the application is being prepared for submission. A meeting with residents was held on 10th March to give an update on this scheme.

<u>Lady's Island Water Level Management Structure</u> – An Bord Pleanála granted planning permission for this development, dated 3rd Sept 2021. Foreshore licence application has been lodged and is under consideration by the Dept of Housing, Local Government and Heritage.

Kilmannock Drainage Scheme – this is a land reclamation and drainage scheme dating from mid 1800s; draining approx 1,000 acres of land near the Great Island Power Station. Environment Dept carried out clearance / maintenance works at the drainage embankment area in Dec 2022. Survey works at the outfall point to the River Suir were carried out in February 2023 to determine the operation of the outlet valves on the drainage system. Further works are required to make the drainage scheme fully operational.

C. WATER, AIR & NOISE

1. Septic Tank Inspections:

139 inspections were carried out in 2022. Wexford had a minimum of 106 inspections to carry out in 2022. All work carried out is external with no requirement to enter a dwelling. Contractors are currently carrying out work on several sites to close outstanding Advisory Notices. A minimum of 130 inspections will have to be carried out in 2023.

Progress is being made with closing existing open files. All files up to the end of 2016 have been closed. 101 files were closed during 2022. 68 extensions of time were granted in 2022. There are currently 56 open files for the years 2017-2021 and 32 open for 2022, a total of 88 open cases. 17 files have been closed in 2023.

Three applications for grant assistance have been received this year to date all of which have been put forward for payment.

There are currently 9 cases in the Court system for failing to comply with Advisory Notices. 5 of these are for hearing and 4 are currently for mention.

2. Air Quality:

Vehicle Refinishers: At end of 2022, 59 facilities were registered with Wexford County Council under the "Deco Paints" Regulations, which is now the largest number in the country. WCC issues Certificates of Compliance to these facilities and issues "On the Spot Fines" of €500 where illegal operators are identified on foot of enforcement investigations – see Table below. The additional facilities were identified on foot of targeted enforcement action in 2022.

Dry Cleaners: At end of 2022, 8 Dry Cleaners and 1 Medical Device Company were registered with Wexford County Council under the "Solvents" Regulations. WCC issues Certificates of Compliance to these facilities – see Table below. Due to targeted enforcement action in Q3/Q4 of 2022, a new category of facility is due to be added to this register in Q2 of 2023.

Petrol Stations: At end of 2022, 80 sites were registered with Wexford County Council under the PVE Regulations, which is the largest number in the country. WCC also issues Certificates of Testing to these facilities under these Regulations – see Table below.

3. Planning

The Environment Section makes an assessment and recommendations on planning applications relating to the environmental aspects of the application.

The main issues regarding the impact of planning on the environment which have arisen in recent years are as follows:

- 1) Density of housing.
- 2) Applications for extensions and upgrades of existing houses on sites where the soil is unsuitable for discharge of wastewater via a domestic wastewater treatment system.
- 3) Applications for detached granny flats and other detached ancillary accommodation.

As of the 28th February 2023, 191 files were referred to Environment from the Planning Department.

4. Duncannon EIP Project

Wexford County Council is currently lead partner in the Duncannon Blue Flag Farming & Communities Scheme. We were successful in receiving funding of €550,000 to run this project for 3 years. We were successful in a 12 month extension to the project for 2022 and further funding awarded of €171,197. In December 2022, the operational group applied for a final 5 month extension until May 2023 and were recently awarded this extension by the DAFM.

The project continues engaging with 35 farmers covering over 950ha of the 1300ha catchment. To date, engagement with all farmers continue with approximately 4 visits to each farm every year where baseline and final "Pollution Potential Zone" surveys are carried out.

The project runs a results-based reward scheme where an annual payment is made to each farmer based on their PPZ survey which ranges from €1,000 & €4,000. The farmer can also avail of a water protection improvement works grant which can be used to carry out like fencing watercourses, establishing arable grass margins, resurfacing clean yard areas, hedgerow establishment, riparian margins etc. To date, the EIP project has paid €320,000 in annual payments to farmers while funding of approx. €35,000 has being paid to farmers that have completed works. It is expected that final works will be completed on lands by 31st April 2023 and sampling under the EIP monitoring programme will be completed in February 2023.

3. Waste Facility Permits:

We currently have sufficient permitted facilities throughout the county, such as Clean Soil and Stone, construction and demolition sites, ATF's / End of Life Vehicles and Pay to Use Waste Compactor Unit. The full list of Waste Facility Permits and Certificates of Registration can be viewed on the Council's website.

Altogether there are 67 registered operational Waste Facility Permits and Certificates of Registration for premises involved in waste management activities in the County. There are 2 applications being processed at present, one new application and one renewal.

4. Enforcement:

The Waste Enforcement Team carries out routine (planned) and non-routine inspections of waste facilities and problem sites or site where we have received complaints. This work is done in accordance with the Recommended Minimum Criteria for Environmental Inspections (RMCEI) as submitted to the EPA on 28 February 2023. The 2023 RMCEI Plan allocates 6,597 routine inspections by 22 Full Time Equivalent staff members. The inspection types cover the WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment) Regulations; ELV (End of Life

Vehicles) Regulations; Waste Management (Packaging) Regulations; Household and Commercial Food Waste Regulations; Batteries, Tyres, Mercury etc.

The Department of Environment, Climate and Communication have set national waste priorities for 2022 to 2024, a three-year target and they are.

- Tackling significant illegal waste activity,
- Construction and Demolition Activity,
- End-of-Life Vehicles (ELV) & the Waste Metal Sector,
- Waste Collection Household & Commercial.
- Producer Responsibility Initiatives and additional local priorities.

Environment Education and Awareness:

Our aim is to promote awareness and active participation in a range of environmental initiatives.

Green Schools: St Edan's NS, Ferns, New Ross Educate Together National School and Colaiste Bride, Enniscorthy have applied for their first Green Flag on the Litter & Waste theme. An assessment will be carried out in these schools and a report forwarded to An Taisce. Approximately 32 schools will renew their flag this year and deadline for renewal applications is Friday, March 24th, 2023 for the 2022/2023 academic year. In total 92 primary schools and 18 secondary schools have been awarded the green flag. A talk was given to all 1st years in Colaiste Bride on Waste prevention and waste segregation on 7th February.

Wetlands Exhibition Workshop: On Friday 3rd February 37 students from Our Lady's Island National School, Broadway visited County Hall and were given a tour and workshop around the Coastwatch Wetlands exhibition. Students from Selskar College also attended the Coastwatch Citizen Science Wetlands exhibition for World Wetlands Day on Thursday 2nd February.

Marram Grass Planting Workshop: A Marram Grass Planting Workshop took place on Tuesday 28th February with a group of 28 students form Ramsgrange Community School. The workshop outlined the importance of our sand dune system, how to harvest marram and replant it. The workshop was facilitated by Aidan Gray, Clean Coasts Officer with An Taisce.









Climate Action School Workshops: We have engaged with Createschool on the Rubbish Film Festival to work with 5 secondary schools. Each school has created a short one minute film and a poster on an environmental issue of their choice. The films and posters will now be judged and A County Award of Best Film, Best Runner Up Film and Best Poster will be chosen. The County winners will be announced on April 18th online. All participating schools have been notified and sent an invitation to attend this online event. The County winners will be forwarded to the National Awards which will be held on the 3rd May in Solstice Arts Centre, Navan, Co Meath.

National Tree Week: National Tree Week takes place March 19th – March 26th and the theme this year is 'Biodiversity Begins with Trees'. We have been provided with 500 native saplings for distribution to schools and community groups during National Tree Week.


100 Million Trees: On 17th February Gorey District Park was planted was planted with 1000 native trees as part of 'The 100 Million Trees Project'. The project is a new national community-driven initiative developed by brothers, Richard and David Mulcahy, which aims to see the planting of 100 million native Irish trees across the island of Ireland throughout the next decade to reverse the environmental damage caused by the reduction of forests worldwide. The project's ambitious aim will be achieved through densely planting between 1,000 and 2,500 native Irish trees at a time across small areas of land using 'the Miyawaki method'. Named after Japanese Botanist, Professor Akira Miyawaki, who developed the technique in the 1970s. By planting excess trees together, they grow considerably faster, denser, are more biodiverse, and most importantly create a very rapid carbon sink and provide excellent areas of biodiversity. Gorey District Park is the fifth site to be planted, Tintern was planted in November and Bride Street Church in December.



Dog Fouling Awareness Campaign: The 'Bag It Bin It' will be reinforced by a social media campaign to run from early March. The campaign is set to firmly emphasize that dog fouling is your responsibility as a dog owner. The campaign will address a range of issues surrounding dog fouling, from its effect on the public who use our streets, parks, and beaches, to attitudes to cleaning up as dog owners, from health issues to civic pride. The campaign will reach across social media and local community groups and Tidy Towns groups will be asked to share images on social media.











Green Dog Walker: The Green Dog Walker Campaign is continually being promoted and registrations are through the website.

Libraries, Archives and Arts CE Report to Wexford County Council,

April 2023

My Open Library New Ross

The second My Open Library service in the County opened in New Ross during March and was officially launched in New Ross Library on 29th March by Councillor Michael Sheehan, Cathaoirleach of New Ross Municipal District.

My Open Library is open 7 days a week from 8am to 10pm, 365 days a year. It is a fully automated service with swipe access by library card and PIN. Usual library services (borrowing, returns, printing, WiFi, internet access PC) are available on an automated self-service basis during My Open Library hours. Already there has been very good uptake of My Open Library membership in New Ross and feedback from users, especially students, has been positive.

Borrow a Biodiversity Kit

This March, the Heritage Council launched their Citizen Science Kit Pilot Programme, an initiative to empower people living in ten counties across Ireland to collect information about biodiversity in their local area. Through the programme, people can borrow specialised equipment from Wexford Town library and use the kit, which includes nets, magnifying glasses and swatches to help identify species and collect valuable data.

The initiative was launched on the 3rd of March, World Wildlife Day by Councillor George Lawlor, Cathaoirleach of Wexford County Council. It is expected that the kits will be used by individual students looking to conduct their own research, amateur ecologists wishing to produce their own biodiversity action plans and by community and youth groups such as Tidy Towns, The Rivers Trust, Field Clubs, Scouts, Guides and Transition year students, who want to gather information to bolster local biodiversity projects.

The data collected by people in Wexford, will be recorded and uploaded to Irelands National Biodiversity Data Centre (NBDC), who collect and manage data and information about Ireland's changes in biodiversity and identify areas of conversation concern. In time, this submitted data will inform conversation strategies and provide evidence for policy decisions.

Sensory Friendly Quiet Hour and Autism Awareness Day, April 2nd

April is Autism Awareness month. Wexford Library Service has purchased some additional resources for families to use during Sensory Friendly Quiet Hour. Sensory puzzles, puppets, DUPLO and emotion/feeling/memory cards will complement the Sensory Friendly Quiet Hour which runs from 4-5pm each Saturday in all our branches. Dark dens, sensory book and toy resources, and new story sacks are all available for use in the branches. There are also a large range of sensory books, toys and assistive resources available to borrow and enjoy using at home.

Seachtain na Gaeilge 1st to 17th March

Seachtain na Gaeilge le Energia is an international Irish language festival and celebration of our native language and culture. All library branches hosted events including a community evening of songs, stories & poetry in Gorey a Comhra as Gaeilge and a traditional music session in New Ross; sean nós dancing workshop and drama workshop for children in Wexford; stories with Sadhbh Devlin in Enniscorthy and stories and games as Gaeilge in Bunclody.

Irish Astronomy Week 20th to 26th March

The inaugural Irish Astronomy Week took place this March. The goal was to inspire people of all ages to connect with the universe and to promote appreciation and understanding of the night sky. To celebrate Astronomy Week, New Ross and Bunclody libraries hosted The Moon, with Dr. Donnacha O'Driscoll. Wexford Branch provided two Astronomy Week Events for schools, A Flying Tour of Our Solar System with Dr. Donnacha O'Driscoll and The Artemis program and returning to the Moon with John Hackett.

National Tree Week 19th to 26th March

Organised by The Tree Council of Ireland and supported by Coillte, NationalTree Week is designed to inspire people to plant and care for trees and to highlight the many benefits they provide to our environment and local communities. Wexford Branch hosted Irelands Forests; Past, Present and Future with Frances McHugh of Teagasc.

Dublin One City One Book – Wexford Author Andrew Hughes

A book by Enniscorthy native Andrew Hughes "The Coroner's Daughter" has been selected as the One City One Book for Dublin in 2023. One Dublin One Book aims to encourage everyone in Dublin to read a designated book connected with the capital city during the month of April. Wexford Libraries will partner with Dublin City Libraries to host an author reading of the book in Wexford Library on 6th April.

Community

ALONE support Co-Ordinators hosted an information gathering at Gorey Library. ALONE strives to enable older people to age at home, safely and securely for as long as they wish. Wexford Volunteer Centre's development and placement officer Eva Law held an information evening about Volunteering with organisations the Soul Sanctuary, ALONE and Gorey Special Olympics in Gorey Library.

A group from Reach Ability, and their support workers attended a morning cinema event in Enniscorthy branch again March 15th

BEAM Bunclody Rehabilitative Training Programme - Providing training to adults with special needs, visited the library weekly to borrow books and use the public pcs and hublets.

Environment

A two-part Upcycling sewing workshop in Enniscorthy Library focused on teaching participants how to safely operate a sewing machine and participants brought along an item of clothing from home to learn a basic alteration or upcycling technique. Students from Ballindaggin NS and their teacher are undertaking the The Butterfly Mosaic Project as part of the ECO-UNESCO Young Environmentalist Awards. Their focus is on the need to promote quality wildlife habitats for endangered butterflies. The project will be on display in Bunclody Library from 23rd March for four weeks. Bunclody Library presented Spring and Summer in the Irish Garden with Maria Ryan of Bell Meadow.

Health and Well Being

Gorey and Enniscorthy Libraries presented Registered dietitian Liz O'Leary who delivered a talk 'Eating Well for Menopause' as part of Healthy Ireland at Your Library programming. Bunclody Library held a Talk on Perimenopause with Rosanne Cahill, Menopause Coach.

Hello How Are You? On March 30th

Hello How Are You? On March 30th is a national campaign by Mental Health Ireland to help connect people and encourage open conversations about mental health. The national campaign highlights the importance of staying connected, helps tackle loneliness, creates a sense of belonging, and builds relationships. It also encourages early help-seeking by providing information about local supports and services.

Enniscorthy library created a display of relevant library books and offered resources e.g., conversation cards to members of the public. An Activator Pole Walking Demonstration with Sports Active Wexford was held in the Library Park, New Ross. Further sessions are planned for May. World Nutritionist Declan Gilmore gave a talk on Nutrition, Exercise, Water and Sleep in Wexford Branch focusing on the four pillars of nutrition, exercise, water, and sleep. Wexford Branch presented an International Women's Day Yoga & Wellbeing Event with Sports Active Wexford.

Adult Events

A History of the GAA in 100 Objects with Dr. Siobhan Doyle was held in Wexford Library. Wexford Science Café held a lecture Talk with Immunologist Cliona O'Farrelly, professor at Trinity College Dublin and Wexford resident on Why do some People not Get Covid Infection?

A History of the Wexford Wildfowl Reserve with Grace Bettayeb took place in Wexford Branch where Grace discussed the dredging of the harbour right up until the rare Greenland white-fronted goose began to use the Slob as a wintering ground.

Ben Barnes, artistic director of Four Rivers and former artistic director of the Abbey Theatre spoke about his life and work in theatre and opera.

Business and Employment

Heritage

On Thursday March 23rd North Wexford Historical Society held their monthly talk in Gorey Library. Brian McMahon, manager of ESB Archives gave an illustrated talk on 'Electrifying Rural Ireland from 1946' with a particular emphasis on Wexford and the Gorey area.

Bunclody hosted Genealogy for Beginners with Celestine Murphy where attendees were given useful tips and information on how to get started in genealogy.

Services to Ukrainian Nationals

Gorey informal English-speaking lessons continued throughout March each Thursday morning. Ukrainian users from New Ross WWETB paid two visits to the library where they availed of a tour of the facility and resources available to all service users.

Free English classed for members of the Ukrainian Community were delivered by volunteer tutors in Wexford Branch. Every Friday morning throughout March, three groups of Ukrainian adults and volunteers were introduced to the services available in Wexford Branch with library tours, information talks on services, and the range of free resources available. All adult visitors were provided with library membership card. Recorder Sessions for Ukrainian Adults were provided by volunteers on Monday mornings in Wexford Library. Distribution of information on library resources and e-Resources to Ukrainian Nationals continues in all branches. Our literacy App for children LOTE4Kids ie digital children's books in Languages Other Than English, is being actively promoted to Ukrainian Nationals as is Transparent Language Online our online language resource which gives access to over 110 languages including English for speakers of over 30 other languages.

World Book Day 2nd March

World Book Day was created by UNESCO as a worldwide celebration of books and reading. World Book Day is marked in over 100 countries around the globe. To celebrate World Book Day libraries give specially selected books to children of all ages to bring home to keep during the month of March. Forming an early habit of reading will greatly improve a child's life chances. There were events held in all branches to coincide with World Book Day (WBD)

STEPS Engineers Week Sat 4TH to Friday 10TH March

Run by the Engineers Ireland STEPS programme (Science, Technology and Engineering Programme for Schools), STEPS Engineers Week, gives children the opportunity to discover engineering through their teachers, parents, libraries and local community. The main aim of the week is to promote engineering, and to show the importance of the profession, to children in Ireland.

Enniscorthy and Bunclody libraries hosted Anyone 4 Science who presented Forces: Test the Strength of Jelly Sweets. In New Ross Library three local schools attend three workshops for Engineer's Week with the Nutty Scientists on Water and Power.Gorey Library hosted two workshops by Anyone 4 Science about Ice Cream Science, while Wexford Branch held the Nutty Scientists Balloon Hovercraft event with a local school.

ARCHIVES

Collections management

In addition to 43 research enquiries via email, telephone and post, a total of 6 researchers visited the Archive during March. Research topics included images and history of the opera train in the Wexford Festival Opera archive (1955-80); class-based assignments for Junior Cycle students on the Tuskar Rock plane crash (1968) and on the number of people admitted to Wexford workhouse during the famine years (1845-48); references through the county council minutes to the Garden of Remembrance at the old Gaol, Hill Street, Wexford (1980-85); research through the handwritten notebooks of Patrick Keegan, Irish Volunteer (1914-18).

Outreach

The Archive continues to collaborate with other heritage organisations in the county to publicly display some of its important artefacts. Wexford artist Francis Danby's [1793-1861] copy painting of Titian's *Allegory of Marriage* was given on temporary loan to the Irish Heritage Trust in late March for display in Johnstown Castle. Danby had studied for a period in Paris in the late 1830s and was inspired by the Titian painting which hung in the main hall of the Louvre Museum. His painting had been gifted to the former Wexford Corporation in 1939 by the granddaughter of William Gibbons who had originally commissioned Danby to execute a copy of the painting in 1838.

The Archive collaborated with UCD's Irish Poetry Reading Archive for the Poetry as Commemoration project, which sought to inspire members of the public into writing poetry based on archival material relevant to the War of Independence and Civil War periods (1919-23). Two afternoon workshops took place in the Archive's reading room in Ardcavan with seven attendees, some of whom were established writers and some novice writers and overseen by poet, Mark Granier. A selection of documents, photographs and objects from the Archive's collections were showcased and formed the basis of some of the themes that were used. The final output will be made available online through the Irish Poetry Reading Archive's website in due course. This has been an invaluable way of engaging the public with local archives and it is hoped to build on this connection with the greater community of writers, poets and artists in the county.

ARTS

Small Arts Festival and Fáilte Ireland Festival Grants Scheme 2023

The Arts Department of is pleased to announce that €47,000 (Small Arts Festival - €25,000 and Fáilte Ireland Festival - €22,000) has been awarded through our grant scheme for Small Arts Festivals and Failte Ireland Festivals taking place in County Wexford during 2023.

These Schemes supports a diverse range of festivals throughout Wexford County. The focus was on festivals of high artistic quality that are innovative and have a strong emphasis on public engagement and visitor experience. A total of 21 festivals were awarded funding out of a total of 33 applications.

Reimagining Enniscorthy

This is public art & community decarbonisation project, taking place in 2022-23 throughout Enniscorthy town. It's a collaborative, place-based response to the climate crisis, and a creative exploration of Enniscorthy as Wexford's pilot Decarbonisation Zone.

Creative Communities

Following an open call, a total of 23 applications were received. The total fund is €30,000 with a further €10,000 available through Creative Ireland which supports collaboration between two or more artists on the Creative Communities Panel with a community group. An independent selection panel will review the applications in the coming weeks and successful applicants will be notified by mid-April.

Tyrone Guthrie Centre Bursary

This open call was advertised in March which enables two artists who are resident in County Wexford to spend two weeks at the Tyrone Guthrie Centre at Annaghmakerrig, the artists' workplace in County Monaghan. Each bursary covers all board and lodging expenses for a two-week period, contribution towards expenses plus the use of a studio if necessary. Closing date for receipt of applications 18th April 2023.

Drama League of Ireland Scholarship

This open call was advertised in March and provides two scholarships for the Drama League of Ireland's Residential Summer School which takes place at the University of Limerick from 22nd July to 29th July 2023. Local amateur participants and members of drama societies are invited to apply for this scholarship. Closing date for receipt of applications 18th April 2023.

Screen Wexford

Funded by Arts & Economic departments of WCC to develop film industry in Wexford. Screen Wexford CLG was established in March 2023.

The Visitor Ep1, The Arrival has been nominated for an award at the finals of The Fresh Film Festival held on Thursday 30th March.

Music Generation Wexford

Wexford Youth Opera Workshop

The Wexford Youth Opera Workshop is developing a Youth Opera around environmental themes and produced in collaboration with the young participants (ages 11- 18) who answered an audition call with Music Generation Wexford. The Opera will premiere in July of this year.

Mini Maestros

Mini Maestros has returned in person and is a workshop offering a great way for parents to join their child (ages 0-5) in the discovery of rhythm, music and singing.

Spring Sessions

Following on from the success of Summer Sessions in the Annexe Courtyard last year, the Wexford Arts Centre in association with Music Generation Wexford and Wexford Co Council held Spring Sessions in March. Hosted by Rachel Grace and featured performances from Ayda, Ash Kiely and Dakota Venn Keane. Making their Arts Centre debut was the Music Generation's Yellow Bellows.

CREATIVE IRELAND

Creative Ireland: Southeast Greenway Art project

Wexford County Council commissioned a team of artists and designers (Esther Gerrard, Aoife Banville and Ed Coveney) to work with local communities on a public art commission along the new South East Greenway, specifically the 5km stretch from New Ross town centre to Shanbog. The focus of this commission is to explore themes of Connections biodiversity, placenames and the many bridges along the 5km stretch of the South East Greenway. March saw the installation of The Track Sculptures.

Sequah: Film Screening

Sequah is a short film by Billy Roche supported by the Creative Ireland programme, the Rosslare Municipal District and Cllr. Lisa McDonald. The film was shot on location in Johnstown Castle in 2021 and is set in the 1900s. It was produced by Ad Personum Cultural Events and directed by Ronan O'Donoghue. It was recently screened in Wexford Arts Centre to a large audience and a copy of the film was presented to Matt Wheeler, Museum Curator of Johnstown Castle Museum.

Annual Financial Statement 2022

Audit Committee

The next meeting is scheduled for the 17th June and will include consideration of the 2022 Annual Financial Statement and financial performance for 2022. The annual review of the Audit Committee's Charter has been completed and as required the charter is included on the agenda for noting by the Council.

Cash Flow/Overdraft

The Council continues to operate with an overdraft facility, Ministerial Sanction is in place for borrowing by way of overdraft in the amount of €20m for the period to the 31st December, 2023.
