Economic Development



An Invest Wexford evening event was held in Dublin on 20th February to promote Wexford as a top FDI location. The event was attended by companies who are considering setting up a second site in Ireland. The benefits of doing business in County Wexford from a business-friendly location, talent, infrastructure, property solutions, proximity to Dublin/Rosslare Europort and the help available to companies locating in Wexford were highlighted on the night.



There are two events planned for 5th March at 6pm in New Ross, "New Ross Leaders Event, Transforming New Ross" and 12th March at 10am in Gorey, "Gorey Leaders Event, Gorey beyond 2020", to support collaboration with the business community in promoting the towns for inward investment.



Business in the Community

Transition Year Students from Coláiste Abbain were given a tour of the Wexford Fire Station which included an explanation of the equipment used, type of incidents that the firefighters deal with and a chance to check out the fire engines.

Afterwards, the group travelled to County Hall, Carricklawn where they were initially given a brief tour of the premises. Students then did mock interviews which were kindly facilitated by staff from a number of departments. The day finished off by the students hearing from staff members who outlined their daily work as well as the journey taken to get to their current position.

Tourism

Neven's Irish Seafood Trails

In October 2019 the production, team for Neven Maguires "Neven's Irish Seafood Trails" was in County Wexford to record an episode for a new instalment in the series. The Wexford episode of "Neven's Irish Seafood Trails" was aired on Wednesday 5th February 2020.

The show highlighted Wexford Town and Kilmore Quay.



The Wexford episode of "Neven's Irish Seafood Trails" was a great showcase for County Wexford and attracted an audience of 229,700 and a 17% audience share.

In February BUCANIER supported 10 Irish companies to attend the Pembrokeshire Food and Drink Supplier to Buyer Event on the 5th of February and attended an Innovation workshop in Carmarthenshire on the 6th as part of the learning journey. As part of the legacy of the BUCANIER project we are working with all the food and drink companies in Wales and Ireland to produce a recipe book containing their products. This will be launched at the close event in Carmarthen in June. We are also planning on two final workshops for participants - The process of innovation with special reference to market validation" and "The steps in developing a market (Marketing Strategy etc.)" these will be held in March and April.



Forward Planning

Wexford County Development Plan 2020-2026: The preparation of the Wexford County Development Plan was paused by Statutory Instrument pending the adoption of the Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy for the Southern Region. Wexford County Council must recommence the preparation of the County Development Plan within 13 weeks of the effective date of the Strategy (31st January 2020). It is anticipated that the pre-draft plan will be submitted to the Members in Q2 of 2020.



National Marine Planning Framework

The National Marine Planning Framework (NMFP) - Consultation Draft has been published by the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government. It is Ireland's first marine planning framework and it applies to a broad range of activities including aquaculture, offshore renewable energy, shipping, ports and harbours, sea fisheries and tourism. It is an important document as it will set the development consent framework for development in the whole marine area. The period during which submissions may be made has been extended to Thursday 9th April, 2020 at 3pm. The Department intend to hold a consultation event in Wexford and details will follow.

Biodiversity and Natural Heritage

In-house Actions: The proposed two week controlled trial of new biodegradable cleaning products will take place from 2nd March 2020. Wexford County Council are on the road to eliminating most, if not all, bleach and chemical cleaners from County Hall in 2020.

Natural Wexford: Work has commenced on a Natural Wexford Sign for both Forth Mountain and Lady's Island. The sign will inform visitors to the area of the importance of the natural heritage in these areas. Scoping is being carried out to decide on the next locations for Natural Wexford signs.

Wex Bee Aware: A small awareness campaign is to run over the spring, to encourage people to plan ahead for the summer, and to create pollinator friendly environments, starting with leaving the first lawn cut of the year until mid-April. Over the spring and summer it is hoped to continue to raise awareness on the small changes people can make to enhance bee and other pollinator populations.

The Girl Guides of Ireland has published its spring campaign in collaboration with Wex Bee Aware to create Teacup Bee Hotels. The publication is nationwide and Wex Bee Aware is looking forward to getting updates and data on the success of the Teacup Bee Hotels in the coming months.

Access Supports

The Recite-Me software, an accessibility and support tool, has been installed on WCC website along with visitwexford.ie and four heritage site locations as follows

- The Irish National Heritage Park
- Hook Heritage
- The Dunbrody Famine Ship
- The Enniscorthy Castle Museum

A new on-line sign language web-based service in accordance with the requirements of The Irish Sign Language Act 2017 will initially be available at Wexford County Council headquarters, Carricklawn from the first of March 2020. This service will be facilitated by CSU and booking procedures which will be informed to staff, the intranet and detailed on Wexford County Councils website in advance of the service going live.

Fáilte Irelands request for information regarding Wexford County Councils programme of best practice examples and supports to provide for accessible tourism initiatives has been facilitated by the Access Section. The information is to be presented at Fáilte Irelands event for local authorities associated with the Wild Atlantic Way, to be held in Kerry the week of the 24th of February 2020.

2. Special Projects:

Min Ryan Park, Wexford: Works nearing completion on the majority of the site, with some landscaping works requiring dry weather to allow for enable completion. The official opening ceremony will be on 11th April 2020.

The Skatepark works contract was issued for tender on 23rd January 2020. Works are expected to commence on site in June 2020.

Trinity Wharf: The application for development approval was submitted to An Bord Pleanála on 15/02/2019. WCC has responded to a request for further information issued by An Bord Pleanála in late July 2019.

The related application for foreshore consent was submitted to Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government on 01/03/2019 and the public consultation process for this application is now completed.

Grant aid of €2.028m has been secured for the scheme under the Urban Regeneration Development Fund (URDF) to date.

Crescent Quay: Works at Crescent Quay are substantially completed.

Templeshannon Regeneration, Enniscorthy: The preliminary designs, environmental studies and planning documents for the proposed pedestrian bridge have commenced and are expected to be completed by May 2020. A draft bridge options report has been received and is being reviewed.

WCC presented revised options for the street and public realm works to the Members of the Enniscorthy MDC in December 2019. Following consultation with the members, a revised plan for these works will now be prepared for public consultation as part of a further planning process in Q1 2020.

Enniscorthy Technology Park, Killagoley: Works are now substantially complete on Phase 1 of the Technology Park.

Gorey Market House: Following discussion at their July monthly meeting, the members of Gorey-Kilmuckridge Municipal District have requested that the development of the 2012 Public Realm plan for the Market House be suspended and that the Council re-examine options for the development and operation of a multifunctional performance venue at the site as proposed in the Public Consultation Process of 2018.

WCC issued a Call for Expressions of Interest / Tender Proposals on 10/02/2020 and 2 submissions were received by the closing date. These submissions are currently being reviewed.

Wexford Arts Centre: An appointment for design services was completed in April 2019 and investigative and building surveys and inspections are substantially completed. The preliminary design is complete and the Part VIII approval was obtained on 13th January 2020. Detailed designs are progressing with tenders scheduled to be invited in May 2020.

John Street Building Regeneration Project: The Council has received initial RRDF funding in the value of circa. €0.328m towards the acquisition and redevelopment of the old grain stores at John Street, New Ross. It is planned to convert these buildings into a high quality enterprise hub. Architects have been appointed for the project and the Part VIII process is due to commence in Q2 2020 with construction planned to be completed by Q3 2021.

High Hill, New Ross: Detailed design and tender documents are progressing and works are expected to commence in Q3 2020. An application for RRDF funding approval for this project as part of the expansion of the New Ross tourism experience was successful.

Esmonde Street: Tenders for design, planning and construction management services for public realm improvement works have been received and an appointment of a consultant is imminent. The Council has received initial RRDF funding to the value of €95,224.00 for this project.

Carrigfoyle Activity Centre: Works have commenced on Phase 1 (access road, car park, trails and services) and is programmed to be completed by Q3 2020.

An RRDF application for funding for the scheme was submitted in August 2019 seeking support for the scheme. This application was not successful.

Enniscorthy Tourism Project: Alan Sherwood & Associates has been appointed to prepare the feasibility study and an application to Failte Ireland for Capital Investment funding.

The project was presented to the Enniscorthy Municipal District at its January 2019 meeting and the report was finalised in August 2019.

An application for funding for the project was submitted to Failte Ireland's Pathways to Growth programme in July 2019 but was not successful in progressing to the next stage.

Kilmore Quay Link Road: Part 8 approval was obtained in February 2019. Detailed designs and tender documents have been completed and tenders for construction works have been received and are being assessed. Works on site are planned to commence in Q1 2020.

An RRDF application for funding for the scheme was submitted in August 2019 seeking support for the scheme, but was unsuccessful.

Gorey Town Park: Niall Barry & Co. Ltd was appointed for the construction of the redevelopment works at Gorey Town Park in March 2019. Works commenced on site in May 2019 and are due to be completed by June 2020.

The playground equipment tender was issued on 31st January with tenders due in by end of February. Works are planned to commence on site in June (following completion of the Niall Barry contract).

Monck Street Enhancement Scheme: Tender documents are being prepared to invite consultants to design and procure this scheme. Appointment is expected in March/April, with works expected to commence on site in early 2021.

WEXFORDIA - INHP, Hook Lighthouse and New Ross Tourism Projects

WCC has secured RRDF funding for the development of a cluster of tourism projects within the county.

Design services are currently being procured for the development of the INHP and the Hook Lighthouse to shovel ready status including securing the required environmental, planning and other consents. Design services for both projects are expected to commence in Q1 2020.

A brief for the procurement for detailed design for the New Ross Transformation Tourism Experience is currently being prepared and is expected to commence in Q2 2020.

Wexford Flood Relief Scheme: A quotation for the Wave and Water Level Modelling study for Wexford and the Burrow CAPOs has been received and Wexford County Council are awaiting funding approval prior to appointment of the Consultant. The project brief for the Flood Relief Main Project has been finalised and will be advertised on eTenders before the end of February.

Enniscorthy Flood Defence Scheme: The Public Consultation Phase is complete, the Public Exhibition Report has been completed and the Confirmation Documents were submitted to the OPW on the 16th December 2019 for submission to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform.

The detailed design for the new Slaney Road Bridge is complete and tender documents for short listing contractors were published on eTenders 05/02/2020.

Advance Works for the Promenade Sewer diversions have been agreed with Irish Water and tender documents for these works are being prepared.

GREENWAYS:

Rosslare Europort to Waterford City Greenway.

Draft feasibility, route options and environmental screening documents have been completed. Public information events were held in Wellingtonbridge & Rosslare Strand in May 2019. The draft EIAR & NATURA Impact reports are being reviewed by WCC and the CPO drawings and schedules are being prepared.

An application for development consent and CPO will be will be submitted to An Bord Pleanála in March 2020.

A presentation to the Rosslare MDC was made in Dec 2019 and January 2020 where the proposals for the 1 way system in the village of Rosslare to facilitate the greenway and the section of greenway between Rosslare Strand and harbour were detailed. The proposals were endorsed by the MDC.

An application for funding, submitted to the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport on 28/11/2018 was not successful.

New Ross to Waterford Greenway / South East Greenway:

Section 85 and funding agreements have been signed by Wexford County Council, Kilkenny County Council & Waterford City & County Council to enable Wexford County Council to act as the lead authority for this project. Detailed design is currently underway and it is planned to tender for a Works contractor in May 2020. Site investigation, vegetation clearance works & the topographical surveys have been completed.

Grant aid funding of €8.0m for the project was awarded from DTTAS on 21/06/2019.

Curracloe to Wexford Greenway:

Permission for the development was refused by the Board in a decision issued on 17/10/2018 citing, in particular, concerns in relation to the potential impact of the development on the Raven Point Nature Reserve Special Area of Conservation and Wexford Harbour and Slobs Special Protection Area.

The Council has reviewed the ABP decision and met with the NPWS to review issues raised in the Planners report. A decision on proceeding with a further application is being considered.

Wexford to Rosslare Greenway

WCC has undertaken a preliminary study to examine the potential for developing a greenway from Wexford town to Rosslare. Further route options assessment, studies and consultation are required to determine the feasibility of delivering this greenway and a brief for delivery of these services is currently being prepared.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Local Community Development Committee (LCDC) & Local Action Group (LAG)

A meeting of both committees took place on the 18th of February. The LAG meeting approved the four Expressions of Interest received from the recent call for North Wexford specific feasibility studies. It also approved a project extension for High Meadows Community Hub. It was noted that €2,180,895.15 of the allocated budget of €5,231,431.21 has been drawn down to date. As the programme ends in December 2020 the programme implementer WLD will put particular emphasis on encouraging promoters to make their claims promptly.

The LCDC proposed the recommendations of the SICAP evaluation committee that to adopt the 2020 plan and accept the 2019 Annual performance Review which found that all KPI's had been exceeded. The committee proposed the LCDC member organisations nominations to the Healthy County Committee;

WEXFORD PUBLIC PARTICIPATION NETWORK (PPN)

Plenary Planning is underway with the County Membership meeting planned for 23rd March at Riverside Park Hotel in Enniscorthy. This event will include a Showcase and membership meeting and will have a theme of 'Connected Communities for All Ages'.

Wexford PPN will see a replacement of its Support Officer at the end of February, with Annette Dupuy departing the role after a term of three and a half years. Annette will be replaced by Ann Marie Laffan.

HEALTHY IRELAND

A meeting of the Healthy County Committee took place on Friday the 21st February and Cllr. John Hegarty was elected Chairperson of that committee. The Healthy Ireland Coordinator Ms Annette Depuy will take up the role on Monday the 2nd March 2020. The launch of the Healthy Wexford County Plan will be held before Easter 2020.

Horeswood Community Gain Fund

A public advice meeting was held in the Horeswood Parochial Hall on Tuesday the 14th January 2020 with the closing date for Expressions of Interest (EOIs), set as the 31st January 2020. 15 EOIs have been received. A meeting of the Community Gain Fund Committee will now be arranged and all members (community) previously elected have agreed to take up their position.

LIBRARIES, ARTS & ARCHIVES

Libraries and Archives

National Library Open Day

Wexford Libraries successfully celebrated the first National Open day on Saturday 29th February. Over 1500 people visited the five libraries to talk to staff and take a closer look at the services and resources available. Library staff demonstrated 3D printing, exploring with VR headsets and how to code with Microbits. People were invited to join in with the usual Saturday events, storytime, browsing the book collection and using library PCs and WiFi and to take time to discover the electronic resources available free of charge at their local library, how to download free eBooks, eAudiobooks, eMagazines, eLearning courses and more to their smartphone, tablet and other devices.

Parenting Today

The third series of free talks for parents in County Wexford libraries was launched by Cathaoirleach Cllr Michael Sheehan in Wexford Library on 18th February. Val Mullally, author and life coach, gave the keynote lecture. In 2020, sixty five talks by qualified professionals, ranging from family fitness and emotional health to language development, from childcare and safety on the internet to ADHD and other learning needs will be delivered in libraries and at four community venues, Bridgetown College and in Raheen, Southend and Taghmon family resource centres. This series is provided with the support of the Wexford Children and Young People's Services Committee.

Archives

The county archive received a deposit of three large historic banners commemorating the 1798 Rebellion from the Dublin Wexford Men's Association. Many men and women from County Wexford, living and working in Dublin were members of the Association, founded in 1897. Banners were manufactured for the '98 commemorations in 1898, 1938, 1948 and for the bicentenary in 1998. It is planned to display at least one of these highly visual banners in the National 1798 Rebellion Centre, Enniscorthy following appropriate conservation repair.

To coincide with the centenary of the death of Seamus O'Brien in Rathdrum, Co.

Wicklow, his grand-daughter presented a large framed photograph of him to the county archive for digitisation. Originally from Morriscastle, Seamus was an active participant in the 1916 Rising in Enniscorthy. Following his release from prison after the Rising, he moved to Rathdrum. During the War of Independence, he served with 'A' Company, 4th Battalion, IRA in Rathdrum and was appointed Brigade Commandant of Wicklow East Brigade. On the evening of 12 February 1920 while standing in the doorway of his premises, he was shot by a bullet from a RIC constable's gun. He is buried in Ballvaldon cemetery, Blackwater.

ARTS

PLASTICS exhibition County Hall: Wexford County Council worked in partnership with the Science Gallery Dublin to bring PLASTIC, a touring exhibition to Wexford. The exhibition, that interrogates our current and future relationship with the material, was opened in County Hall on Friday 28 February by Patrick Prendergast, Provost of Trinity College Dublin. The exhibition runs until 17th April, it features the work of over 30 national and international artists, designers and scientists. It contains a newly commissioned work by artist Ed Devine which was derived during a co-design

workshop with communities and schools in Wexford. Ed Devine will also be running a free two day workshop in March with local communities in Wexford exploring music instrument making using recycled plastics. Free tours of the exhibition are available to groups and schools, throughout the seven week run of exhibition.

'Safe hold', Christine Mackey exhibition, Wexford Arts Centre: The Safe Hold exhibition was opened on Friday 28th February by Paddy Woodworth, author and journalist. It is an outcome of the Wexford County Council M11 Per Cent for Art commission in 2019 awarded to artist Christine Mackey. During this residency, Mackey worked with local communities and Wexford County Council to develop a number of sites with pollinator friendly plants in the Gorey area. In addition, the artist worked with local communities to actively engage in solutions for habitat loss and transform underutilized sites into environmentally sustainable pollinating pastures for our bees to inhabit and for native wild-flowers to take hold. As part of her residency a planting scheme is planned for Enniscorthy this spring.

Public Art, Wexford Wales's commission: Wexford County Council Ireland Per Cent for Art is committing €24,000 in match funding for an artists' residency programme across Wexford and Wales, as part of the Ancient Connections programme led by Pembrokeshire County Council in Wales. An open call went out in February and closing date for applications is early March 2020. During this 2 year residency period, two artists will connect across Wexford and Wales around the residency theme of 'Exploring a Shared Past' and work with local communities in both countries. Final outcomes will be new artworks presented publicly in Wexford and Wales in 2022.

Inclusive P.E (2.2): 27 female and 1 male staff from Riverchapel National School received a demo on the use of Inclusive P.E games for their students.

Wexford COPD Peer & Exercise Support group (2.2): Sports Active Wexford staff & Wexford Working Men's Shed held a Scooch demo for the Wexford COPD Peer & Exercise Support Group in Clonard Community Centre. 22 males and 13 females took part.

Remember Me (2.2): Sports Active Wexford led an activity session for Remember Me service users from Dublin on residential respite in the Ferrycarrig hotel. One female and 10 males took part.

2019 Pavement Schemes

The following schemes were either awarded or commenced in 2019 and will be completed in 2020.

N30 Clonroche from Ballymackessy to Tomfarney.

This scheme commenced on September 30th. 2019. Works recommenced on 20th. January and will be completed by 14th. March.

Pavement Repairs N25 Ring Road Wexford, N25 Orristown Junction Killinick

This scheme was tendered in October 2019.

A contractor was appointed in November 2019.

This scheme will be commenced in the first quarter of 2020.

2020 Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII) Allocation:

The 2020 TII road improvement allocation has been received from TII.

The following schemes will be carried out in 2020;

- N30 Mountelliot Pavement Scheme
- N11 Kileen to Newtown Phase 2 Pavement Scheme
- N25 New Ross Roundabout to Clonard Great Pavement Scheme
- N11 Ferns Pavement Scheme

N30 Mountelliot Pavement Scheme

This scheme runs from the newly constructed Mountelliot roundabout to the R731 Ballyanne iunction in New Ross.

Contract documents are substantially completed and it is hoped to tender this scheme by the end of February.

N11 Kileen to Newtown Phase 2 Pavement Scheme

This scheme runs from Ferrycarrig Bridge to the Maldron roundabout on the N11.

Works are progressing on the tender documents. This scheme should be tendered in the first quarter of the year.

N25 New Ross Roundabout to Clonard Great Pavement Scheme

This scheme may be postponed until 2021 due to its proximity to the N11 Kileen to Newtown scheme.

It will most likely be replaced by a pavement scheme on the N25 form Holmestown to Tomcool. Survey works have commenced and will be completed in February.

It is expected to tender this scheme in the second quarter of the year.

N11 Ferns Pavement Scheme

Preliminary archaeology investigations were carried out in 2019. Further archaeological investigations are required to be carried out in advance of the pavement scheme going ahead. The timing of the pavement scheme will become clearer once the archaeological investigations have been completed.

Verge Maintenance

Tree pruning and verge maintenance was carried out on the N25 Ring road in Wexford and the N11 from the Maldron Roundabout to Kitestown.

Winter Maintenance

The 2019/2020 winter maintenance programme commenced on Monday 14th. October 2019. There have been 37 no. call outs up to Sunday 17th February 2020.

Public Lighting LED Upgrade (Non National Roads)

Over 7,000 lanterns have been upgraded to Led since the beginning of 2016. It is hoped to upgrade the remaining 5,700 lanterns on non-national roads and housing estates in 2020.

TII Energy Efficiency Schemes

Wexford County Council has applied to TII to upgrade the remaining lights on national routes to Led in 2020.

Audit Committee

The next Audit Committee is scheduled for Wednesday 25th March 2020. The committee will meet the LG auditor at this meeting to discuss the 2019 Accounts and associated Audit Report. Ms Catherine Tuohy, has been appointed LG Auditor for Wexford County Council for the 2019 Audit and will be the auditor meeting with the Audit Committee in the absence of Mr Gerard McMorrow, LG Auditor.

Finance Report - Qtr 4 2019

The Q4 financial report has been circulated and provides a provisional position in relation to the 2019 financial performance. The preliminary figures contained in this report indicate a surplus on the Revenue Account will be reported again for 2019 making this the sixth consecutive year to report a surplus on the Revenue Account. As there is still work to be completed on the end of year transactions this is subject to change and a more detailed report on the 2019 financial performance will be presented to members once the final accounts for 2019 are complete.

Annual Financial Statement 2019

Work has commenced on the preparation of the 2019 Accounts. This work will take a number of months but it is expected that the Council will meet the submission deadline of the end of March.

Capital Programme 2020 - 2022

A draft of the 2020 – 2022 Capital Programme is included on the agenda for consideration of members. The programme contains a list of proposed major capital projects to be progressed over the next three years and the estimated spend on the projects during that time. The programme assumes funding will be in place through the sources available to the council which are grants, borrowing, planning levies, and internal reserve funding. Where funding does not materialise projects cannot be progressed and alternatively where additional funding becomes available during the term of the programme these projects will be added. An introductory note to the programme sets out the basis for the programme as presented.

Cash Flow/Overdraft

The Council continues to operate in overdraft, Ministerial Sanction is in place for borrowing by way of overdraft in the amount of €13m for the period to the 31st December, 2020.
