1. Confirmation of Minutes

Cllr. G. Carthy enquired if there was any update from An Bord Pleanála on the Section 5 application submitted by Wexford County Council. Cllr. Carthy also sought clarity in relation to the retention application submitted by the developer and queried if the Council can validate a planning application for the site when there is no decision on the Section 5 application.

1.2 Special Meeting of Wexford County Council (Housing) 8th January, 2024On the proposal of On the proposal of Cllr. B.A. Murphy and seconded by Cllr. K. Codd Nolan the Council resolved to confirm the Minutes of the County Council (Housing) Meeting on 8th January 2024.

Cllr. G. Carthy enquired what the delay is in producing an affordable housing strategy which he requested months earlier.

Cllr. F. Ó'Súilleabháin noted that an affordable housing survey is being conducted and sought reassurance that this won't delay matters.

2. Section 183 of the Local Government Act 2001:

2.1 Consideration of the renewal of the lease of property at Coolcotts Community Centre to Clonard Area Development Association Ltd.

On the proposal of Cllr. G. Lawlor, seconded by Cllr. J. Hegarty the Council resolved to renew the lease of property at Coolcotts Community Centre to Clonard Area Development Association Ltd., in accordance with the terms set out in the S.183 Notice as circulated.

2.2 Intention to dispose of property at 7 Old Garden City, Gorey, Co. Wexford

On the proposal of Cllr. D. Kenny, seconded by Cllr. J. Sullivan the Council resolved to dispose of property at 7 Old Garden City, Gorey, Co. Wexford, in accordance with the terms set out in the S.183 Notice as circulated.

3. Part XI of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 (as amended) and Part 8 of the Planning and Development Regulations, 2001 (as amended):

3.1 LAC2305 - Proposed residential development of 60 no. units in a mix of 1, 2 and 3 bed units, and all ancillary site and enabling works at Killeens, Wexford, Co. Wexford.

Having considered the report of the Chief Executive, on the proposal of Cllr. J. Hegarty, seconded by Cllr. T. Forde, the Council resolved to approve the Part 8 for the construction of 60 no. units in a mix of 1, 2 and 3 bed units, and all ancillary site and enabling works at Killeens, Wexford, Co. Wexford. in accordance with the terms of LAC2305, as circulated.

3.2 LAC2313 - Provide a public realm space which will incorporate a playground for younger children, seating, a pocket park, lighting and landscaping at Kilmuckridge, Co. Wexford.

Having considered the report of the Chief Executive, on the proposal of Cllr. M. Farrell, seconded by Cllr. W. Kavanagh, the Council resolved to approve the Part 8 for a public realm space which will incorporate a playground for younger children, seating, a pocket park, lighting and landscaping at Kilmuckridge, Co. Wexford in accordance with the terms of LAC2313, as circulated.

4. Wexford County Council Revised DRAFT Climate Action Plan 2024 -2029

Pursuant to the provisions of the Climate Action and Low Carbon Development (Amendment) Act 2021 as it amends the principle Act of 2015, on the proposal of Cllr. M. Farrell, seconded by Cllr. W. Kavanagh, Wexford County Council resolved to adopt the Wexford County Council Climate Action Plan 2024 – 2029, having considered the draft plan, the contents of the Chief Executive's report on

submissions received during the period of consultation and the SEA and AA reports and determinations, carried out in accordance with the requirements and regulatory provisions of the SEA Directive (DIR 2001/42/EC) and Article 6(3) of the EU Habitats Directive (Directive 92/43/EEC).

Mr. T. Enright thanked Ms. C. Godkin and her team for the huge work which went into drafting the Plan.

On the proposal of Cllr. M. Farrell, seconded by Cllr. G. Lawlor, the Council resolved to move to public consultation on the Draft Litter Management Plan 2024 - 2027, as outlined in the circulated memo.

On the proposal of Cllr. A. Connick, seconded by Cllr. M. Whelan, the Council resolved to approve to send a delegation of two Members to Hartford to attend the 52nd Annual Greater Hartford St. Patrick's Day Parade on 9th March, 2024.

8. Chief Executive's Report

On the occasion of Chief Executive Tom Enright's last Council meeting, Cathaoirleach J. Fleming advised the Members that Mr. Enright would make a presentation prior to taking questions on the Chief Executive's report.

Mr. T. Enright said he wished to acknowledge the work done in collaboration with the Members over his ten-year tenure as Chief Executive. Mr. Enright detailed the work done to establish the Municipal District offices, the Council's response to major emergencies whilst acknowledging Billy Kinsella's tragic passing, the Council's response to Covid, and Cllr. Fergie Kehoe's tragic passing.

Mr. Enright acknowledged some of the major social and economic infrastructural projects delivered and thanked the Members for their commitment in funding such projects and the Fleadh bid. Looking to the future, Mr. Enright said it is important to increase the numbers visiting tourist attractions in Wexford, and he emphasised the importance of progressing the advance factory in New Ross and the Kilmore Quay Business Park.

After a sustained round of applause, the Members spoke glowingly about Mr. Enright's contribution to Wexford and the legacy he leaves behind. Numerous contributors spoke of his vision, integrity, ambition, approachability, honesty, courtesy, empathy, and respect. The following Members paid

Mr. E. Hore spoke on behalf of the Management Team and acknowledged the huge contribution made by Mr. T. Enright to County Wexford during his tenure and spoke of the enduring legacy he leaves behind.

The meeting adjourned for a comfort break at this point.

- Can a representative body for disabilities be added as a notifiable body for the purpose of planning applications?
- It was noted that rates bills have been altered to remove the notification that you can pay your bill at the post office. It was agreed that future bills will include the post office as a payment facility.
- Update on Trinity Wharf progress.
- Disbelief expressed that north Wexford is getting only €50,000 out of €3.75m active travel funding.
- What applications for active travel funding were made for north Wexford?
- Request that the unsuccessful applications for north Wexford be analysed to establish why they didn't receive funding.
- Does Wexford County Council have a role in identifying accommodation centres?
- Frustration expressed in relation to SETU's delay in providing information for master planning.
- Request for bus stops in Bunclody to be funded through active travel.
- When will the register of electors be available?

- What is the status of the 65-unit development in Bunclody?
- Who will house Ukranians after 90-day period has elapsed?
- How many litter fines are paid in full, how many partially paid, and how many stopped?
- Number of vacancies in the Fire Service?
