#### Traditional Song Workshop — Learn to create with Rachel Uí Fhaoláin

Traditional singer Rachel Uí Fhaoláin will show you how to develop song writing and singing skills in the traditional style. Rachel will guide children and young people through the creative skills of writing songs while using existing airs from the tradition. Young people will also learn a song from Rachel's collection of newly composed songs. This macaronic song is based around a fun traditional rhyme with a folklore theme. Rachel will conduct the online workshop through English and Irish to encourage the use of the cúpla focail. This workshop is aimed at age 8+ and family participation is encouraged.

#### Printmaking with Andrea McCorry

Join art educator Andrea McCorry, from Gorey School of Art, for a fun and imaginative workshop demonstrating relief printing techniques. For this workshop, Andrea will be using common recycled materials from the home, limiting the expense or necessity to source specialist materials. This workshop is aimed at children 10-13 years of age but could suit younger children with adult assistance.

#### Make your own Monster Magazine

Artist and educator James Merrigan will show you how to use your imagination through drawing and writing about your very own mythological creature, sometimes called monsters. We will begin by looking at mythological creatures from the past, such as the Griffin, Pegasus, the Mermaid, and Centaur. Then we will create our own mythological creatures by collecting and putting together toys and objects from around the house and drawing from them. Finally, we will make a small zine, and put our mythological creature into a story. Workshop is suitable for children from 7-12 years and adult assistance is required.
