I refer to your request received in this office, which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act (2014) for records held by this FOI body.

- Provide the reasons for the refusal; and
- Provide details of my rights to seek an internal review and appeal to the Office of the Information Commissioner.

If clarification is required to process this request, please contact me before refusing the request or applying any administrative refusal provisions.

I look forward to your response within the statutory timeframe.”

The decision maker in this case was Ms. Sharon Ryan, Senior Staff Officer, Housing Section. The decision has been made to grant your request.

Right of Appeal

Your appeal should include a fee of €30 which can be made payable to Wexford County Council. You should make your appeal within 4 weeks from the date of this notification, where a day is defined as a working day excluding weekends and public holidays. However, the making of a late appeal is permitted in appropriate circumstances. The appeal will involve a complete reconsideration of the matter by a more senior member of the staff of this body.

If you are unhappy with the response you receive to your internal review request, you have a right

to appeal to the Office of the Information Commissioner. This appeal must be made within 6 months of the date of the internal review decision and may be made by writing to:-
