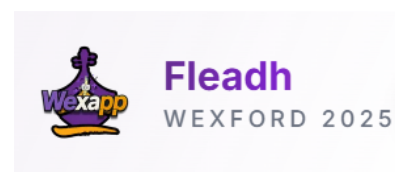
## VOLUNTEER APP

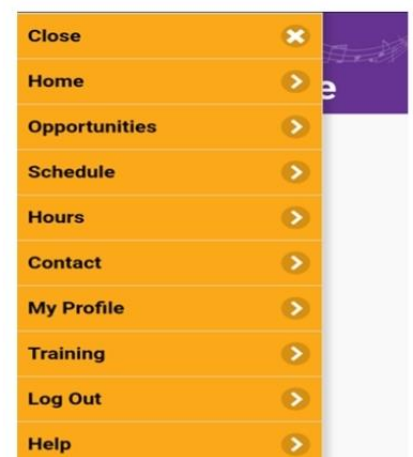

## GETTING READY TO VOLUNTEER

You will be sent information regarding times available to collect your pack. Make sure to bring your volunteer pack to your shift which will include all the materials you need for your volunteering role.

Your team leader will check in with you in advance of your first shift. Information about your allocated shifts are available when you log into the volunteer app. You can also sign up for additional shifts in your allocated area on the app.

Contact your team leader if you have any queries or if unavailable contact the volunteer line: 053 9196035 (9am – 5pm)

### On the day:

- If you have a few words of Irish, try to use them as a starting point when greeting the public if you can do so. E.g.
  - “Fáilte go Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann” means “Welcome to Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann”,
- Consider the weather and whether you need specific clothing – e.g. hat, extra layers etc.
- If outside remember to be SunSmart – think shades, sun hat, and sunscreen.
- Light refreshments will be available at the Volunteer Hub (water, hot beverages, sandwiches).
- Consider bringing your own water bottle and coffee/tea cup for a more sustainable volunteer experience.
- Public water fountains and refill stations, are available in some competition venues and the following locations:
  - St Peter’s Square – Y35 ER2F
  - Tourist Office on the Quay – Y35 YV25
  - Trimmers Lane – Y35 DP20
  - The Bullring – Y35 XP48

## Fleadh Parking

There is a Park and Ride system in place for the Fleadh – follow the directional signage, directing you to the most suitable carpark. There is a charge of €10 per vehicle but volunteers can use the carparks free of charge on your volunteering days. Volunteers are encouraged to use the Park and Ride system as much as possible.

In order to access free parking in the park and ride system you **must arrive wearing your volunteer t-shirt and wearing your volunteer lanyard**. The entrance to the Volunteer Hub is through these green doors which are directly across the road from JJ Devereux LTD.



This is the location where you can get ready for your shift, enjoy the atmosphere with other volunteers and access welfare and refreshments. Further toilet locations around town are provided in the General Information/FAQ section.

Those volunteering in event venues or at car parks will sign in directly at the venues. If you have an outdoor role, you will sign in for your role in the volunteer hub or information offices, as directed by your team leader - please check in advance.

Personal belongings should not be left behind. However, if necessary, these will be left at your own risk.

## KEEPING IN CONTACT

Below we have set out how we plan to keep in contact with you before and during the Fleadh.

As you know you have been receiving information emails and texts. We will continue to send these up to the Fleadh week, as necessary, providing you with more details.

During the Fleadh we will provide key daily volunteer announcements via text.

For your team, your team leader will be the key contact. You may need to contact your Team Lead for example for the following the following:

- If you are running late for your shift
- If you are unavailable for any reason
- If you would like to volunteer for additional shifts

If for any reason you are unable to contact your team lead, please contact the Volunteer Line: 053 9196035 (9am – 5pm).

In summary you have three main means of contact to communicate with the Volunteer Coordination team as follows:

- Up to and during the Fleadh – contact your Team Leader which will be provided after you are allocated your shifts
- During the Fleadh – contact the Volunteer Line – see phone number on inside cover of this booklet



## **HEALTH & SAFETY - VOLUNTEER INFORMATION**

While you have received Health & Safety Training, below we have set out a reminder of some key information.

### **Lost Children / Vulnerable Adults Procedure**

The event organisers will be providing wristbands at the Fleadh and these will be handed out to parents of younger children and guardians of vulnerable adults where required.

The parents/guardians contact details can be written on the wristbands thereby enabling more efficient repatriation where they may become separated/lost. Volunteer protocol for a lost child/vulnerable person (informed by best practice) is as follows:

- Remain in situ with the child/person, unless doing so is unsafe.
- Two adults should remain with the child/person.
- Call the number on the wristband if available.
- Where no wristband, the volunteer should remain with the child/person and summon a security officer/ Team Leader who will contact Event Control by radio / landline.
- If in any doubt, contact a member of the security team or An Garda Síochána

Lost children/vulnerable persons should not be repatriated unless the person temporarily supervising them is fully satisfied, they are being handed over to their rightful parent/guardian. Any reluctance on the part of the child/person to go to the supposed parent or guardian may result in an escalation of the situation to the relevant authority, i.e. in the first instance An Garda Síochána. If a lost person cannot be repatriated, then a member of An Garda Síochána should be notified at which point the person may be brought to the Garda Station.

## Accidents/Incidents

Emergency numbers and medical support information are detailed on the inside cover of this booklet.

All accidents and incidents should be reported to your team leader who will advise of action to be taken. This should be as soon after the accident/incident as possible.



# LITERACY AWARENESS

## Let's talk about literacy!



In Ireland, one in six adults has unmet literacy needs. This means that many people are unable to read directions, fill in forms or understand instructions.

## Being Literacy Friendly when assisting Fleadh patrons!

### ✓ **Be aware of the signs** you may encounter for example:

- Reluctance to fill in a form
- Body language, shy or withdrawn behaviour
- Providing excuses for not writing e.g. forgot my glasses

### ✓ **How can you help?**

- Consider the signs – be 'literacy aware'
- Be personal, direct and clear when communicating
- Offer your help
- After you explain information or give instructions, ask the person to repeat it back in their own words.
- Sometimes all it takes is the question: 'What are you going to do now?'

The information office is where people can go to get programmes (Clár), general information, maps etc.

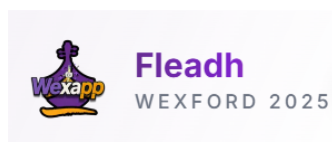
### Fleadh Office

## **Toilets Facilities**

- Volunteer welfare including toilets are available in the Volunteer Hub.

- ‘Changing Places’ Toilet is an accessible sanitary facility with a toilet, hoist, washbasin, adult-sized changing bench and optional shower with adequate space for use by persons with a range of disabilities who may require assistance. These are available in the following locations:

## **Sensory Spaces**

There is a sensory area in Wexford Town Library from Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> – Saturday 9<sup>th</sup>. There will be mobile sensory pods available at some points throughout the festival. Please see Wexapp or social media for updates.

## **Accessible Viewing Areas**

The “Wexford Credit Union Gig Rig” is a temporary stage erected on Wexford Quay front where free concerts will take place over the week. This year there is also a second “Gig Rig” called Ardán na Sláine Stage, located in Church Lane Carpark – Y35 RT2N.

There will be a specific accessible viewing area cordoned off at the front of each of the Gig Rigs. Seating and space for wheelchair users will be provided in this area.

## **Event Schedules**

- Ardán na Sláine Stage: Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> – Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> August

- Craft Village: Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> – Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> August





## COMPETITION SCHEDULES

Competition events will take place from Friday 8<sup>th</sup> to Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> August, and are spread around the town, in schools, halls, community centres etc.

If you are assigned to an event venue, you should go directly to the venue where you will be asked to sign in and be given your instructions. Please ensure you are dressed in your volunteer T-shirt and wearing your lanyard. Your team lead will brief you on your duties for the shift.

The following pages outline the Clár Ama - competition schedules, locations and times. The schedules are divided into four geographic zones across the town. Colour coding assists with age categories.

You are likely to receive regular requests for information about event dates, times, locations, directions etc. so it is imperative you always have this booklet to hand.
