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Section 1 Introduction

1.1 Introduction

The Local Government Reform Act 2014 saw the abolition of the Town Councils and their structures and, as a result, the Town Access Focus Groups' functions ceased. A new consultation process was introduced to cover each of the Municipal Districts consisting of drop in/open meetings to be held each year in each Municipal District; these meetings are in addition to the new Public Participation Network for Wexford County Council.

The aim of the public consultation event held on 21st July, 2015 at The Court Services Building, Civic Square, Gorey was to help identify the key issues regarding accessibility, access and disability-related access issues and universal design for the plan area.

This report, which summarises the issues raised at the public consultation event, is presented in four sections:

Section 1 provides an overview of the public consultation process undertaken.

Section 2 outlines the key objectives.

Section 3 concludes the report and outlines the next stage in the plan preparation process.

Section 4 lists the persons and bodies, their submissions and observations and provides Wexford County Council's responses to those issues.

1.2 Consultation

The pre-consultation stage consisted of the following activities:

- Invitations (seventy-two in total) were sent to local community groups, stakeholders, and relevant government departments informing of the intention to review the Disability Strategy Implementation Plan, and inviting these parties to a public consultation event on 21st July, 2015.
- A notice was published in the local newspapers covering the period from 7th July to 14th July, 2015 informing the public of the intention to review the Disability Strategy Implementation Plan and inviting their attendance at the public consultation event.
- 3. As a result of the extensive area under the remit of the Gorey Municipal District Area, it was decided to advertise the public consultation event via as many avenues and in as many formats as possible. In this regard, notices were included in Parish Newsletters during the weekends of 11th/12th July and 18st/19th July, 2015 and were read out to congregations in many parishes.
- 4. A radio campaign was arranged and ran from 16th July to 21st July, 2015 to inform of the public consultation event.
- 5. Notice of the public consultation event issued via Wexford County Council's MapAlerter System to persons within the Gorey Municipal District Area.
- 6. Notice of the public consultation event was displayed on Wexford County Council's website and staff intranet.
- 7. Additional supports available at the public consultation event to facilitate access for all included the provision of a sign language interpreter and visual presentations.
- 8. The public consultation event was well attended with 30 people signing the attendance sheet.

1.3 Submissions and Observations

Written submissions and observations could be made in the period from 6^{th} July to 7^{th} August, 2015. A total of 13 submissions/observations were received – 11 at the public consultation event on 21^{st} July, 2015, one via email and one via the post prior to the event.

The submissions/observations received covered a wide range of issues from a lack of or access issues with footpaths; policing of disabled parking bays; provision of sign language interpreters for public events/festivals; and access to Gorey Hospital and Gorey Garda Station.

Completed Submissions/Comments Sheets could be submitted to the Access Section staff at the public consultation event on 21st July, 2015, or any time prior to the deadline for receipt of same i.e. 7th August, 2015.

Section 2 Disability Strategy Key Objectives

1. Access issues re footpaths in the Ballycanew area

- Wexford County Council proposes to carry out an assessment of the footpaths in the area.
- Funding has been sought to install a footpath from the IWA Training Centre to the Village Centre, subject to receipt of same works to be carried out.
- To seek funding for immediate works subject to assessment with regard footpath outside local business, Tina's Hair Salon.
- (Additional item). Subject to funding, an upgrade of the current belusha beacon crossing point to be considered.

2. Enforcement of Blue Badge parking

- The parking app pilot initiative which assists to identify disabled parking locations within Gorey Town Centre to be rolled out by first quarter of 2016.
- Community Wardens will continue to have abuse of disabled parking bays as a top priority.
- Roll out the Text Alert pilot initiative for disabled parking spaces by end of 2015.
- The Gorey District will refer this matter to the Joint Policing Committee as an agenda item.
- 3. Obstacle created by a step at the following locations:
 - (i) on route to Tesco, near pedestrian crossing in front of central school; and
 - (i) on route from train station to Ambers Springs Hotel.

Both these areas to be assessed regarding accessibility issues by end of 2015.

4. Obstacle created by a telephone pole with wire on the ground on route from train station to Dominic Smith's

To be assessed regarding accessibility issues by end of 2015.

5. Route to Ramstown Business Park

This area to be assessed regarding accessibility issues for consideration in the 2016-2017 Footpath Programme.

Section 3 Conclusion

3.1 Conclusion

The Access Section would like to thank the local community for taking the time to make written submissions and observations and attend the public consultation event held on 21st July, 2015. The consultation process has been an extremely valuable information gathering exercise. There are many reoccurring issues throughout the submissions and it can be concluded that the local community consider these to be priority issues to be addressed.

The Access Section will continue with the preparation of the Gorey Municipal District Disability Strategy Implementation Plan 2015-2016 based on the outcome of the submissions, findings and responses of the public consultation.
