## **Buildings and Structures for Protection. Towns and Villages.**

### **1. Ballyedmond**

Two-Storey, thatched house.

Single-storey, thatched cottage of four bays.

Single-storey, thatched cottage of four bays.

Single-storey, four bay thatched cottage.

### **2. Blackwater**

“Shell Cottage”: Thatched house with applied shells on battered walls.

Bridge with two, shallow arches

Three-bay, two storey thatched house (near Catholic church)

Catholic church with early – 19<sup>th</sup> Century presbytery at the rear.

### **3. Bunclody**

Church of Ireland church: early 19<sup>th</sup> century church with tower and spire.

Elaborate mid – 19<sup>th</sup> century additions.

“J. Furlong”: brick, mid – 19<sup>th</sup> century, Italianate building.

Bridge over the Slaney: of six arches, late 18<sup>th</sup> Century.

### **4. Castlebridge**

Catholic church: circa 1840, early gothic revival.

Church of Ireland church, circa 1840.

Cast-iron conservatory of Castlebridge House.

Mill buildings – being restored.

Below the Catholic church – a house of three bays and three storeys.

Mill buildings at the junction of Gorey – Wexford road.

Como Lodge: early – 19<sup>th</sup> Century gothic revival house.

At West end: thatched, four-bay house.

**5. Craanford**

Large circa 1840 barn church.

Thatched house opposite church.

Mill building.

**6. Duncannon**

The fort dating from the 17<sup>th</sup> century.

Two martello towers behind the town.

Duncannon Church of Ireland church: gothic revival of J. H. Fuller.

Lighthouse and other buildings within walled enclosure opposite Church of Ireland church.

**7. Ferns**

Church of Ireland Church dating from 1816 and incorporating part of the medieval cathedral.

Well with small ? dated 1847 below Church of Ireland church.

“The Old Mill”, a five-bay, three storey early nineteenth century house with wide eaves.

**8. Fethard**

Church of Ireland church: early – 18<sup>th</sup> century and later.

Fethard Castle.

**9. Foulkesmill**

Mill building of 1851.

Polldoon house, late 18<sup>th</sup> century.

**10. Kilmore Quay**

See schedule contained in Kilmore Quay Village Development Plan.

**11. Kildealy**

“J. Bowe” thatched public house, marbled lettering.

**12. Kiltennel**

First Fruits type church with later aisle and tower.  
Pedimented entrance arch.  
Thatched lodge.  
Old National School.

**13. Oilgate**

Catholic church: early gothic revival features.  
Row of two storey artisan houses with plaques.

**14. Screen**

Thatched cottage strategically placed at crossroads.  
“Patrick Fortune”: Small house with good lettering, at right angles to road.

**15. Taghmon**

Catholic church: mid 19<sup>th</sup> century gothic revival.  
Church of Ireland church.  
Three-storey house dated 1836.  
“Whelan's”: a three-bay, three-storey house.  
Five-bay, two-storey house with round-headed doorcase – dated 1777.  
Taghmon Castle.

**16. Templescoby (Jamestown)**

Small First Fruits church.  
Sexton’s house of 1845 and school.

**17. Templeshanbo**

First Fruits church with tower.  
Former school house.

**18. Tomhaggard**

Four-bay, three-storey house, early 19<sup>th</sup> century.  
Thatched house west of village; Mass House.

Early 19<sup>th</sup> Century barn church with tower.
- 2. Ballindaggan**  
Large, circa 1840 barn church; walls of checkered stone.
- 3. Ballygarrett**  
Church with massive, lighthouse of a tower.
- 4. Ballymore**  
Barn church of 1830.
- 5. Ballymurn**  
Church of 1832 with important interior, plasterwork, and gallery.  
Maher chapel.
- 6. Barntown**  
Church by Pugin 1844.
- 7. Bellevue**  
Gothic revival church by J. J. McCarthy.
- 8. Bree**  
Simple barn church by Pugin.
- 9. Clongeen**  
Barn church with venetian window.
- 10. Clonroche**  
Barn church with gothic revival façade.
- 11. Courtnacuddy**  
Single-cell, gothic - revival, church.
- 12. Davidstown**  
Entrance arch below the church.
- 13. Glenbrien**  
Small barn church in perfect condition.
- 14. Glynn**  
Late- 18<sup>th</sup> Century barn church.
- 15. Hilltown**  
Barn church with classical interior.

16. **Killinierin**  
Well-detailed gothic- revival church.
17. **Kilmyshall**  
Barn Church with screen façade of circa 1830.
18. **Lady's Island**  
Late 19<sup>th</sup> Century gothic - revival church.
19. **Old Ross**  
Late 19<sup>th</sup> century gothic - revival church.
20. **Oulart**  
Early-19<sup>th</sup> century gothic - revival church.
21. **Piercetown**
22. **Ramsgrange**  
Church with huge tower dated 1865.
23. **Rathangan**  
Large, impressive church with tower and spire circa 1850.
24. **Rathnure**  
Simple 19<sup>th</sup> century church.  
Entrance arch – very elaborate.
25. **Tagoat**  
Important Pugin church of 1846.
26. **Taylorstown Bridge**  
Possibly late 18<sup>th</sup> century church – now a hall.

### Church of Ireland Churches for Protection

1. **Ardamine (Riverchapel)**  
Important, gothic –revival church circa 1860.
2. **Ballyboro (Killegney)**  
First Fruits church with West tower.
3. **Ballybuckley**  
First Fruits church with West tower, 1832.
4. **Ballycanew**  
Mid 18<sup>th</sup> century L-plan Church and high wall.

5. **Ballycarney**  
First fruits church with West tower, crenellations.
6. **Carrick**  
Church of 1822 with later decoration.
7. **Hollyfort**  
First Fruits church with tower.
8. **Killann**  
First Fruits church with West tower, in manner of Semple.
9. **Killurin**  
First Fruits church with West tower.
10. **Kilscoran**  
First Fruits church with West tower.
11. **Kyle**  
Small, First Fruits church in manner of Semple.
12. **Wells**  
Small, mid – 19<sup>th</sup> century gothic revival church.
13. **Whitechurch**  
Single – cell possibly mid 18<sup>th</sup> century church.

### Country Houses for Protection

1. **Artramon**  
Large early 19<sup>th</sup> century house rebuilt this century.
2. **Ballinkeel**  
Italianate house by Daniel Robertson 1840-42.
3. **Ballyanne**  
Neo-classical entrance gated with piers and half-hexagon facades of twin lodges.
4. **Ballycarney Cottage**  
Small, circa 1820 house – good of its type.
5. **Ballymore, Camolin**  
Rare survival of circa 1720.
6. **Ballymore, Screen**  
Late 18<sup>th</sup> century house.

7. **Ballynestragh**  
One of the last country houses, by Dermot Gogarty 1937.
8. **Ballinatray Bridge Courtown**  
Small, highly elaborate tudor-gothic confection of circa 1840.
9. **Ballyrankin**  
Small, three-bay lodge with strip pilasters and wide eaves.
10. **Ballystraw**  
Early-18<sup>th</sup> century, Palladian house.
11. **Ballytrent**  
Early 19<sup>th</sup> century neo-classical house.
12. **Ballywater**  
L-Plan Italianate house of rubble stone with brick dressings.
13. **Bannow**  
Early- 19<sup>th</sup> century neo-classical essay.
14. **Bargy Castle**  
Late-medieval tower with later post-medieval additions.
15. **Berkeley Forest**  
Small, late 18<sup>th</sup> century, neo-classical house.
16. **Bloomfield**  
Neo-Tudor House by Daniel Robertson.
17. **Borleagh**  
Early – 19<sup>th</sup> century, late classical house.
18. **Borohill**  
Early-19<sup>th</sup> century with unusual pyramidal roof.
19. **Borrmount**  
Five-bay, mid-19<sup>th</sup> century, Italianate house.  
Stables with small tower.
20. **Brookhill House**  
Italianate house of 1850.
21. **Brownswood House**  
Red brick house of 1894.
22. **Castleboro**  
One of the most magnificent ruins in Ireland – by Daniel Robertson circa 1840.  
Stables in Italianate style.



L-plan, rubble-stone house by Benjamin Woodward, circa 1860.

- 53. Peppard's Castle**  
Lime-rendered, mid-18<sup>th</sup> century house with later porch.
- 54. Pilltown**  
Simple gothic style house of circa 1830.
- 55. Ramsfort**  
Complex building of several dates including 18<sup>th</sup> century, circa 1860 French chateau and later castle style.
- 56. Rathaspick**  
Important late 17<sup>th</sup> century house.  
Lodge in extravagant circa 1900 "Swiss cottage" style.
- 57. Richfield**  
Medieval towerhouse and early – 18<sup>th</sup> century house with fine interior.
- 58. Rockspring**  
Two-storey, octagonal lodge.
- 59. Rosegarland**  
Possibly by John Roberts added to an early-18<sup>th</sup> century house.  
Towerhouse in yard.
- 60. Rowesmount**  
Small, early-19<sup>th</sup> century house with doric doorcase.
- 61. Rosemount**  
Mid 18<sup>th</sup> century house.  
Dovecote on hill above house.  
Early 19<sup>th</sup> Century lodge with wide eaves.
- 62. St John's Enniscorthy**  
Late – 18<sup>th</sup> Century house with full-height bows on façade.
- 63. St. Waleran's Gorey**  
Bowed neo-classical house in manner of Morrisons.
- 64. Saunder's Court**  
Exceptionally elaborate entrance arch and lodges.
- 65. Slaney Lodge, Bunclody**  
Four-bay, two-storey house of rubble stone, said to be 17<sup>th</sup> century, remodelled in early-19<sup>th</sup> century.

Lodge with doric portico.  
Lodge on Enniscorthy road (originally the main entrance).

- 23. Castle Talbot**  
Mid-18<sup>th</sup> century house.
- 24. Clobemon Hall**  
Fine neo-classical house by Thomas Cobden.  
Stables.  
Entrance gates and sweeps.
- 25. Clohamon**  
Bow-fronted late-18<sup>th</sup> century house.
- 26. Clonard Great**  
Mid-18<sup>th</sup> century Palladian house
- 27. Coolbawn**  
Ruin of a Tudor-gothic by Frederick Darley circa 1840.
- 28. The Deanery, Ferns**  
Early-18<sup>th</sup> century house with additions of 1835.
- 29. The Deeps**  
Colonial style house with colonnade across the façade.
- 30. Dunbrody**  
Large mid-19<sup>th</sup> Century, Italianate house.
- 31. Edermine**  
Much-rebuilt late-18<sup>th</sup> century house with Italianate tower and wing.  
Chapel by Pugin, cast-iron conservatory.
- 32.
- 33. Horetown**  
U-plan house of circa 1840.
- 34. Hyde Park**  
Important neo-classical house by Sir Richard Morrison.
- 35. Johnstown Castle**  
Neo-gothic castle by Daniel Robertson.  
Ancillary buildings and ornamental garden.
- 36. Killiane Castle**  
16<sup>th</sup> century tower house and 18<sup>th</sup> century house.

- 37. Killowen**  
Early-19<sup>th</sup> century house with Wyatt windows.
- 38. Kilmannock**  
Large mid-18<sup>th</sup> century house remodelled in mid-19<sup>th</sup> century.  
Lodge of 1879 possibly by Sir Thomas Drew.
- 39. Kyle House**  
Neo-classical house of circa 1800.
- 40. Litterbeg**  
Small, mid-18<sup>th</sup> century Palladian house.
- 41. Loftus Hall**  
Mid-19<sup>th</sup> century house.  
Mid-18<sup>th</sup> century gate piers.
- 42. Macmine Castle**  
Ruin of a townhouse with later additions.  
Entrance arch in gingerbread gothic of late 18<sup>th</sup> century.
- 43. Macmurrough**  
Early 19<sup>th</sup> century neo-classical house.  
Mid-19<sup>th</sup> century venetian-gothic lodge and gates.
- 44. Marfield**  
Late 18<sup>th</sup> century house with good quality modern additions.
- 45. Monart**  
Fine mid-18<sup>th</sup> century Palladian composition.  
Entrance gates.
- 46. Monksgrange**  
Fine Palladian composition of 1769 with twentieth century additions.
- 47. Mount Anna**  
Late 18<sup>th</sup> century house with bow front.
- 48. Nevillescourt**  
Simple mid-18<sup>th</sup> century house remodelled in late 18<sup>th</sup> century.

- 51. Newtownbarry**  
Large Italianate house of circa 1860 by Sir Charles Lanyon.
- 52. Parknashoge**

- 66. Stokestown**  
Circa 1830 house with granite porch.
- 67. Octagonal folly tower on hill.**
- 68. Stokestown Castle.**  
Tower house set in a range of farm buildings. Both tower and farm buildings with gate-piers of importance.
- 69. Talbot Hall**  
Late-18<sup>th</sup> century, three-storey house.
- 70. Verona**  
Small mid-18<sup>th</sup> century house.
- 71. Wells**  
Large tudor-gothic house by Daniel Robertson of 1850.
- 72. Wilton**  
Impressive sham-gothic castle by Daniel Robertson of the 1840s.  
Stables with an early-18<sup>th</sup> century doorcase.  
18<sup>th</sup> century bridge opposite the house.  
Gate piers and walled garden.
- 73. Woodbrook**  
Very fine neo-classical house of 1780 with staircase unique in Ireland.
- 74. Woodview, Ballingale Ferns**  
Three-bay, two storey over semi basement, built in 1760s.

- 1. Allenstown Little**  
Single-storey thatched house with attic.
- 2. Ballaghkeen (Bolaboy More)**  
Thatched cottage of five bays.
- 3. Ballask, Lady's Island**  
Late-18<sup>th</sup> century, four-bay cottage with porch and fanlight above.
- 4. Ballask, Kilmore**  
Three-bay cottage with wide windows and porch.
- 5. Ballinesker**  
Unusual, L-plan thatched house beside road.
- 6. Ballinesker**  
Five-bay, single storey, thatched house.

7. **Ballinesker**  
Long, thatched house at right angles to, and on the east side of the main road.
8. **Ballyconnigar**  
Five-bay, two-storey thatched farmhouse.
9. **Ballyduff Lower**  
Three-bay rubble stone lodge with brick dressings circa 1850.
10. **Ballygarra, near Carne**  
Two-storey thatched farmhouse.
11. **Ballygarran**  
Four-bay thatched cottage.
12. **Ballygarrett**  
Small, three-bay thatched cottage.
13. **Ballygarrett Little**  
Thatched, single storey house of four bays.
14. **Ballygillane Little**  
Two-storey, thatched farmhouse.
15. **Ballyhought (Old Unyoke)**  
Two-storey thatched public house.
16. **Ballymitt**  
Four-bay thatched cottage with bars on windows indicating early date.
17. **Ballymitt**  
Hipped roof on thatched cottage of four bays.
18. **Ballymoty Beg**  
Two storey thatched house.
19. **Ballynamire**  
Two-storey thatched farmhouse with single-storey addition.
20. **Ballysheen**  
Two-storey thatched farmhouse.
21. **Ballysimon**  
Four-bay, two-storey thatched farmhouse.
22. **Ballyvaloo**  
Long, thatched cottage with porch.
23. **Ballyvergin**  
Very fine two-storey farmhouse.

- 25. Chapel**  
Two-storey thatched house with hipped roof.
- 26. Churchtown, Lady's Island**  
Four-bay cottage with heavy thatch on roof.
- 27. Churchtown, Lady's Island**  
Five-bay single-storey thatched 'gentleman's residence.
- 28. Coddstown Great**  
Three-bay, two-storey thatched house with good fenestration.
- 29. Coddstown Little**  
Very fine two-storey thatched house.
- 30. Coolgarrow.**  
Five bay, two storey thatched cottage with porch.
- 31. Coolhull**  
Three-bay cottage with porch and thatched roof.
- 32. Coolrainey**  
Small thatched house with whitewashed walls.
- 33. Coolrainey**  
Three-bay, thatched cabin.
- 34. Coolroe**  
Five-bay, thatched house.
- 35. Coolattin**  
Four-bay, two-storey farmhouse with local slates on roof.
- 36. Courtclough Lower**  
Five-bay, two-storey thatched house with heavy batter.
- 37. Cullenstown**  
Four-bay thatched cottage with granite doorcase.
- 38. Cullenstown**  
Exceptional folk-art applied shellwork and thatched roof.
- 39. Curraclloe**  
Two-storey thatched farm house.
- 40. Duncormick**  
Five bay, two-storey thatched public house – Sinnotts.

- 41. Eardownes Great**  
Four-bay, thatched house.
- 42. Gerry**  
Important, five-bay, thatched house with battered walls.
- 43. Gibberwell**  
Four-bay thatched house with buttress on left side.
- 44. Glebe Blackwater**  
Four-bay, thatched cottage.
- 45. Johnstown**  
Three-bay thatched cottage with wide eaves.
- 46. Killenagh**  
Long thatched house and public house.
- 47. Kilmacoe**  
Well-preserved thatched cottage with whitewashed walls.
- 48. Lannagh**  
Four-bay single storey thatched cottage.
- 49. Libgate**  
Thatched cottage with high-pitched roof.
- 50. Milltown, ED Kilscoran**  
Four-bay thatched cottage with limewashed walls.
- 51. Milltown ED Kilscoran**  
Three-bay, two-storey, whitewashed house with hipped roof - beside road.
- 52. Nemestown**  
Long, two storey house of five bays with hipped thatched roof.
- 53. Nemestown**  
Three-bay, single-storey cottage with half-hipped thatched roof.
- 54. Newtown ED Kilscoran**  
Three-bay, two-storey thatched house.
- 55. Newtown ED Kilmore**  
Two-storey thatched house with back to road.
- 56. Newtown ED Kilmore**  
Two-storey thatched house with distinct batter.
- 57. Newtown ED Kilmore**  
Small, three-bay thatched cottage.

- 58. Newtown ED Kilmore**  
Four-bay cottage with high pitched roof and porch.
- 59. Orristown**  
Thatched cottage.
- 60. Pollmanagh Little**  
Three-bay, two-storey thatched farmhouse.
- 61. Richfield**  
Small three-bay, thatched cottage.
- 62. Rickardstown**  
Four-bay, two-storey thatched farmhouse.
- 63. St. Awaries**  
Four-bay, two-storey farmhouse with thatched roof and porch.
- 64. St. Iberius**  
Two-storey house with heavy thatch.
- 65. St. Iberius**  
Four-bay, thatched cottage with porch.
- 66. Sarshill**  
Long, low, two-storey thatched house.
- 67. Slievenagorea**  
Two-storey thatched house.
- 68. Whitefort**  
Small, two-storey thatched house.
- 69. Whitefort**  
Thatched cottage with whitewashed walls. Well kept.
- 70. Yoletown E.D. Tacumshane**  
Four-bay, two-storey thatched house with good proportions and surfaces.

- 1. Artramon Castle**  
Medieval tower.
- 2. Baldwinstown Castle**  
Late Medieval tower house.
- 3 Ballyhack**



- Late-medieval tower house.
- 4 Ballyteigue Castle**  
Tower house in good condition.
  - 5 Butlerstown Castle**  
Late medieval tower house.
  - 6 Castleboro**  
Large semi-fortified house, of circa 1600 of considerable architectural interest.
  - 7 Castletown House near Carnsore Point**  
Late-medieval ruins.
  - 8 Churchtown, Carne**  
Tower house with three-storey wing in ruins.
  - 9 Churchtown, Sigginstown**  
Tower house with three-storey wing.
  - 10 Clough Castle, Clough East**  
Tower house.
  - 11 Coolhull Castle**  
Two-storey hall block probably 16<sup>th</sup> century.
  - 12 Deeps**  
Semi-fortified house – in ruins.
  - 13 Dunbrody**  
Important late – 16<sup>th</sup> century or early 17<sup>th</sup> century brick built house.  
Stables, also of brick, behind the house.
  - 14 Ferrycarrig**  
Small, towerhouse.
  - 15 Hilltown House**  
Late medieval tower house.
  - 16 Mount Garrett Castle**  
Early – 17<sup>th</sup> century tower beside road.
  - 17 Mylerspark**  
Star fort.

## Bridges And Miscellaneous Items For Protection

1. **Ballycarney Bridge**  
Very fine seven arch early – 18<sup>th</sup> century bridge.
2. **Ballinatrav Bridge**  
Very high bridge with a single span.
3. **Bellevue, near Ballyhoge**  
Gate piers, sweeps and twin lodges of mid- 18<sup>th</sup> century.

5. **Browne Clayton Column**  
Corinthian column by Thomas Cobden 1841.
6. **Camolin Park**  
Old Coach House and Stable Block.
7. **Carrigmannon Bridge**  
19<sup>th</sup> century bridge.
8. **Clohamon Bridge**  
Late 18<sup>th</sup> Century of five arches.
9. **Coolattin Bridge**  
Bridge and small vernacular corn mill on West side of road.
10. **Corbally Bridge**  
Three arch road bridge.
11. **Courtown House**  
Gate lodge
12. **Doran's Bridge**  
Hump-back, three arch 18<sup>th</sup> century bridge.
13. **Edermine**  
Pounder Mausoleum of 1853.
14. **Garrylough Mill**  
Whitewashed mill building.
15. **Hill Castle near Tagoat**  
Late 18<sup>th</sup> century lodge with pyramidal roof.

- 16. Hook Head Lighthouse**  
Medieval tower and later buildings in picturesque composition.
- 17. Kilcarbry Bridge**  
Mill Buildings.
- 18. Kyle Cross Roads**  
Important early-19<sup>th</sup> Century composition in brick, once thatched, possibly once stables.
- 19. The Leap**  
Smithy built of rubble stone.
- 20. Newtown, Ferrycarrig**  
Round Tower built as Crimea War memorial.
- 21. Ramstown Lower**  
Master's house of former workhouse.
- 22. Saltmills**  
Bridge and Causeway.
- 23. Scarawalsh Bridge**  
Very fine mid-18<sup>th</sup> century bridge.
- 24. Solsborough**  
Gate piers.
- 25. Watch House Village/Clonegall**  
Five-arch bridge shared with Carlow.
- 26. Wellington Bridge**  
Fine single-arch bridge dated 1815.
