


Fig. D1: Winter Close Section at Location No.1.

1. Introduction

This document is prepared to highlight issues relating to the implementation of active travel routes along or through the north and south sloblands of Wexford Harbour and the impact it may cause on the wintering migratory birds in the Wildfowl Reserve and sloblands. The document suggests mitigation measures which could be implemented to avoid bird disturbance and it is intended to facilitate discussion with the National Parks & Wildlife Service on this subject.

2. Suggested Routes:

The following are possible trail routes under consideration which would traverse through or around the sloblands.




Fig. 2: Four Possible Routes from Ferrybank to Curracloe: Purple In-land Route, Green Linking Route, Blue Route along perimeter and Yellow Coastal Route.

It is intended that all routes would segregate the pedestrian trails from the existing farm access paths. This issue primarily concerns the blue route above.




Fig. 3: Two Possible Routes from Wexford to Rosslare Strand:

3. Risk Assessment of Bird Disturbance:

The single most critical impact of routing a trail near or through SPA's is the disturbance to bird feeding and roosting. A risk assessment was undertaken to consider the possible impacts on the slobland bird of various measures which could be implemented for the proposed trail routes. The assessment used a five point score severity by likelihood matrix to evaluate the disturbance impact on birds. The assessment considered reserve security, control of trail access, visual & noise disturbance, trail enforcement and other forms of disturbance. A detailed build up of all the disturbance related risks which were considered is presented in appendix A.

The key risks to emerge from the assessment are summarised below;

- 1. The use of typical timber post & sheepwire fencing 1.4m in high along the trail boundaries will not prevent unwarranted access into the reserve or sloblands. Narrow ope sheepwire with base kerbing would prevent dogs from leaving the trail but would not prevent an errant walker from climbing over the fence. Preventing access over the trail fence is central to closing the route along the reserve during the winter season.
- 2. Farm access paths leading off the public roads at Beggerin Island and Hook Bridge Road on the north slob are generally open and there is no clear signage to deter walkers or cars from driving around the farm path network through the sloblands. The public road entry to the south slob farm paths is a mix of open or locked gates and barriers.

- 3. Visual and noise disturbance from trail users was found to be the most intrusive impact on bird feeding and roosting along a wide zone adjacent the proposed trails. The only boundary treatment which eliminated the visual and noise disturbance was a fully clad timber screens along the route.
- 4. The deployment of trail wardens during the open season would reduce bird disturbances particularly as some of the nuisance activities such as drones or camping cannot be easily designed out. The installation of CCTV cameras at the winter close locations should be considered as part of trail enforcement.
- 5. The use of fully clad timber fencing was found to greatly reduce other types of bird disturbances such as their feeding in the zone adjacent the proposed trail, the extended daytime use a trail would offer particularly during the peak season.

Emerging from the risk assessment of bird disturbance the following measures could be applied to the proposed active travel routes through the North and South Slobs;

- Trail Boundary Treatment: Typical timber post & sheepwire fencing along the trails boundaries is not sufficient. Narrow ope sheepwire with base kerbing would prevent dogs from leaving the trail but higher fencing is required to prevent walkers climb over the fence. The only boundary treatment which eliminates visual and noise disturbance from trail users is a fully clad timber screens.
 - a. A 1.8m high timber clad screen would be sufficient to block visual and noise disturbance adjacent the reserve and canal areas, see TCD/300/05. The extent of cladding could be terminated at sufficient distance away from the reserve and canal areas. Along the paddocks the cladding could be replaced with a 1.8m high timber post & 6 rail fence & chainlink fence similar to TCD/300/02 with screen planting.
 - b. On the opposite trail boundary along by the entire base of the slob wall a 2.4m high paladine fence would be erected, see standard details TCD/100/06.
- 2. **Farm Gates to Sloblands:** Entry to the sloblands off the public roads at Beggerin Island and Hook Bridge Road on the north slob and the pump house and Killiane farm on the south slob should remain closed throughout the year and particularly during the winter season. Prominent signage should be placed at the gates advising the public about bird disturbance, possibly bye-law fines

and recommending nearby trail as alternative leisure routes with map directions and WCC phone number. The above arrangement for the gate would need to be agreed with the slob commission. The closing of gate need not be for every instance a farm machine passes the gate but possibly after an assignment of work is complete. The idea is that the gate is closed over gaps in work activity.

- 3. Winter Closure of Trail: It is proposed during the winter season to close a section of the trail from the reserve to the wood edge at the Raven Point, see appendix D. The closure period would be from the start of October to end of April. The trail would be closed by 2.4m high paladine gates with similar fencing extending into the slob wall vegetation, see FIG. D2 & D4 in appendix D. This combined with the proposed continues fencing of both sides of the trail boundary would form an effective barrier to any trail user.
- 4. Warden: The deployment of trail wardens during the open season would be very beneficial to reducing nuisance activities occurring along the trail. The installation of CCTV cameras at the winter close locations and at Cullenton's Gap would contribute to trail enforcement. These cameras could be connected to WCC's network system at Ferrybank. If it were legally and technically possible a live feed could be directed into the Wildfowl Reserve offices.
- 5. Viewing Points: Should the timber clad screen be used extensively on the trail boundary then consideration should be given to placing a limited number of viewing points for trail users. These viewing points need not be as elaborate as a bird hide, they could be as simple as a one-way glass panel in the timber cladding see detail TCD/300/05 or a raised decking point as per detail TCD/1000/03. These features could be placed near the reserve ponds, raven channel and at the wood edge near Cullenton's Gap.
- 6. **Hedge screening to farm access path:** Complement hedging could be planted along the existing farm access paths. This can be as simple as planting narrow bands of reeds along path verges. This would need to be discussed with the slob commission.
- 7. Signage: Erect direction, warning and information signage along ATR. Trails should be well sign posted with trailhead signs, way marker posts, no entry warning signs and information signs of ecology, landscape or heritage where appropriate along the route.

These measures are suggested for further discussion with stakeholders with the sloblands around Wexford Harbour.

5. Monitoring Regime:

As the Wexford Sloblands are a winter destination for migratory geese and in particular the white fronted greenland goose, it is important that the introduction of any infrastructure on the sloblands should be closely monitored.

It is proposed that monitoring should be undertaken for prior to any trail development taking place, during its construction and for some years after when the trail is in use.

Prior to Construction:

Once a preferred route for any trail is agreed, data should be collected of bird feeding and roosting in the vicinity of the proposed route. If field data is available then it should be check that the format and type of data is comparable to data that would be collected at future stages. The data should be specific to fields and paddocks where a trail will be routed and include bird type and numbers.

The collected data should be reviewed to extract any construction constraints to be incorporated into the design and methods of working.

During Construction;

Any trail would be constructed in the summer season but monitoring should continue to identify any issues that may emerge. Should the monitoring highlight any issues adversely effecting protected bird species then these issues would need to be brought to the attention of the construction team as soon as possible and a working solution agreed between WCC / contractor and NPWS.

Post Construction:

Crucially the monitoring of bird activity should be continues for a few years after the trail is open for use. This monitoring should be undertaken each month at various section of the route, different times of the day and during open and closed periods of the trail. CCTV camera data which could include the number of trail users but also the date & time trips were made. This data could then be comparing against monitored bird activity. Importantly this information would show if specific fields and paddocks close to any new trail were continuing to be used as before by birds taking into account grass management rotation on the sloblands.

Dear Gerry,

I refer to your letter of 18/8/17. I apologise for the delay in responding. The proposed route passes through lands of the Minister for Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht at The Raven Nature Reserve and lands co-owned by the Minister and Birdwatch Ireland at Wexford Wildfowl Reserve. The route also passes through the Wexford Harbour and Slobs Special Protection Area and the Slaney River Valley Special Area of Conservation.

The outline proposal has previously been the subject of pre-planning consultation with the Development Applications Unit of this Department (ref letter dated 30/6/14, copy attached) and a meeting with local senior staff (ref minutes of 11/1/17, copy attached).

While the documentation provided by Wexford County Council identifies the general nature and location of infrastructure, it does not address the concerns previously expressed. The Department, given its role as statutory consultee in the planning process, cannot comment further without the provision of a Natura Impact Assessment for the proposal.

Previously expressed concerns about the scale and nature of the development, given its location and in particular its potential for significant adverse impact on the Greenland White-fronted Goose, are re-iterated. This species is of conservation concern in Ireland due to the proportion of the declining International population found here and the highly localised and therefore vulnerable nature of its distribution.

I have been asked by An Bord Pleanála to refer further to the above-mentioned proposed development which is before the Board for consideration.

Having examined the plans and particulars lodged with the application, the Board hereby notes and requests the following:

- (a) It is considered that the submitted newspaper public notice (dated the 6th March, 2018), as required under Section 177AE (4) of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, is inadequate and does not accurately describe the nature and extent of the proposed development. In this regard, you are required to re-advertise the public notice and furnish a copy of same to the Board once advertised. The minimum time period of six weeks should again be allowed for the making of submissions/observations in relation to the proposed development. The nature and extent of development as described should be consistent with the site notice submitted (dated the 28th February, 2018) and, in particular, should provide a more accurate description of the proposed route of coastal greenway and make reference to the separate Ferrybank Looped Trail along the R741 Regional Road to Ardcavan.
- (b) The Board requires that the following prescribed bodies should be notified of the planning application and afforded the opportunity to make a submission/observation to the Board:
- Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht (Development Applications Unit)
- Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government
